





09. Visits during Quarter

<u>A) Rural Electrification Corporation</u> <u>Limited (REC) Visit</u>



On November 21, 2023, a team from REC conducted a site visit to Anandam, a 140-bedded home for the homeless currently under construction. This significant project has been generously funded by REC under their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative. During the visit, the REC team thoroughly inspected the construction site and expressed their satisfaction with the progress and quality of the work being carried out.

A concise presentation was delivered to the REC team, outlining the utilization of the funds they provided and detailing how the financial support has been effectively employed in the ongoing construction of Anandam, the 140-bedded home for the homeless.



B) Management Development Institute (MDI) Visit







We successfully conducted the National Immersion Program in Sustainability Management (NIPSM) for PGDM students from the Management Development Institute from October 14 to October 18, 2023. The NIPSM is a unique initiative designed to provide PGDM students with a firsthand, real-life experience concerning the practical challenges related to development and governance issues in rural India. A total of 26 participants actively engaged in the program, which included visits to various Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) such as Ibtada, Sapna, and Nirvana Foundation. Throughout the immersion, participants gained insights into a diverse array of critical issues, including education, micro-finance, women empowerment, community development, social welfare, and local governance.

10. DRI Goat Rearing Livelihood Project

In March 2022, the Goat Rearing Livelihood Program was launched with the aim of enhancing the annual income of underprivileged families, as part of the CSR initiatives of **Desiccant Rotors**International Pvt. Ltd.
