## (A) Health Camp



he first health camp was successfully conducted on February 22nd and 23rd, 2024, at Shaheed Bhagat Singh Park, Sector 31, Noida. This initiative, under the CSR program of Tata Power Ltd., aimed to provide essential healthcare services, screenings, and awareness to women and girls from nearby slum areas.

Approximately **1,200 women** and girls benefited from the camp.

The activities included general health check-ups, specialist consultations, self-defence training, and legal counseling.

#### **Medical Services Provided**

A dedicated team of doctors and healthcare professionals offered free consultations and screenings, ensuring quality healthcare for all participants.



#### **Screening & Tests Conducted**

- Blood Tests: 250 tests, including Thyroid and Sugar tests.
- **Vision Screening:** 200 eye check-ups, with 20 patients identified for cataract surgery.
- **Medicine Distribution:** Free medicines were provided to all patients as prescribed by the doctors.





#### **Awareness & Training Sessions**

Apart from medical check-ups, additional sessions were conducted to empower women and girls with self-defence training and legal awareness.

#### **Self-Defense Training**

- Conducted by Knockout Fight Club.
- Around 70 girls participated in hands-on self-defence techniques.
- Training included basic combat skills, escaping grabs, and confidencebuilding exercises.



#### **Legal Counselling**

- Provided by advocate Mrs. Shivani Rafiq.
- Around **40 women** received legal advice on issues such as domestic violence, property rights, and women's safety laws.

#### Impct & Conclusion

The two-day camp had a **significant impact on the local community**, particularly the underprivileged women and girls. The initiative not only addressed their healthcare needs but also empowered them through self-defense training and legal guidance.







The overwhelming response from the community reflects the necessity of such initiatives, and we look forward to organizing similar programs in the future to continue promoting health, safety, and empowerment for women and girls.

#### **Shiv Niketan: A Home of Dignity and Hope**

In our continued effort to bring **shelter** and **dignity** to the poorest families in the villages surrounding Vijay Mandir, Alwar, we are proud to share the story of our **third Sapno Ka Ghar.** This home stands as a symbol of hope, and this time, it belongs to Maya—a resilient woman with a story that moved us deeply.

Maya is a 40-year-old woman from a small village in Alwar. Her life took a tragic turn in 2019 when her husband died by suicide, leaving her alone to raise their three young children—an 8-year-old daughter and two sons aged 10 and 12. In the aftermath of her husband's death, her in-laws refused to support her. With nowhere to turn, Maya and her children lived in a fragile jhopadi made of mud and straw, barely able to withstand the seasons.

To survive, Maya **worked** in the **fields** of others—earning just enough to feed her children, but never enough to build a safe life. The **fear** of not having a roof over their heads haunted her every day.





Moved by her courage and unyielding spirit, we at **SAPNA** knew we had to **help**. On a small patch of land that she owned, we built **Sapno Ka Ghar-03**, a permanent and secure house that could truly be called home. Built at a **cost of ₹3.5 lakhs**, the house includes **two rooms** and **a kitchen**, covering **450 square feet.** It is simple, strong, and filled with warmth.

The house was made possible through the generous support of Ms. Manisha Singh Ma'am, Shri RRP Singh Sir, Ms. Anubhooti Singh, and Ms. Ishita Singh. On 4th January 2025, the home was inaugurated by Ms. Ishita Singh and Ms. Manisha Singh Ma'am. That day, Maya walked into her new home with tears in her eyes and joy in her heart. Her face reflected the quiet strength of a mother who never gave up.



This third Sapno Ka Ghar is **named Shiv Niketan**, in loving memory of **Late Shri Shiv Pratap Singh**, **father of Shri RRP Singh Sir.** It is more than a house—it is a place of dignity, safety, and new beginnings for Maya and her children.



At SAPNA, we believe that a home is not just a structure of bricks and cement. It is the foundation of a life lived with respect and self-worth. Sapno Ka Ghar is our commitment to the forgotten, the abandoned, and the brave—like Maya—who deserve a chance to dream again.

## **Capacity Building Training**





On **11th January 2025**, Sapna Shikshalaya arranged a capacity building program facilitated by Shri Narendra Mishra, a resource Indiannica person from **Learning**. With a wealth experience from conducting life skills education and management workshops in over 750 schools, Shri Mishra brought valuable insights for the participating teachers. The session primarily focused on the use of EdTech tools and their effective implementation in classrooms.

The workshop began with engaging ice-breaking activities. Shri Mishra highlighted how such activities help students transition smoothly between subjects while keeping them attentive and interested. These interactive methods also promote better classroom participation.

He then discussed key aspects of the **National Education Policy (NEP)** and the **National Curriculum Framework (NCF).** He explained curricular goals, essential student competencies, and modern pedagogical techniques that align with current educational needs. His presentation was simple, practical, and filled with useful takeaways for teachers.

In the final part of the session, teachers participated in **group activities** designed to reflect on the concepts covered during the workshop. These collaborative exercises encouraged them to think about how to apply the new strategies in their own classrooms. Overall, the session proved to be enriching, equipping teachers with fresh ideas and effective tools to enhance their teaching practices.





## Reunion of Juba Murmu with her family



On September 1, 2024, an unidentified woman named Juba Murmu was brought to Delhi's Safdarjung Hospital. She spoke Bangali, making it difficult for anyone to understand her. Due to this language barrier, she was unable to clearly state her identity or home address. She repeatedly expressed her desire to return home, but without sufficient information, sending her back was not possible.

As time passed, and after continuous efforts, Juba Murmu mentioned her husband's name as **Pagol** and her father-in-law's name as Moso. She stated her home address as "**Dulo Narayanpur Jungle, Havda, Kolkata**" and mentioned that she belonged to a **tribal community**. However, due to the language problem, locating this address remained a significant challenge.

On **December 14, 2024,** when no solution seemed to be working, the organization reached out to their **former employee, Tushar,** who was from Bangal. Tushar attempted to understand Juba's address over the phone and guided the organization accordingly.

Following his instructions, we searched for Dulo Narayanpur on **Google**Maps and, by checking the street view, contacted a **medical store owner** in Bahir Khanda, Tarakeshwar, Howrah. The store owner and his father **confirmed** that Juba was from their area.

They further confirmed that Juba's village was around 3-4 kilometers from their location and that she used to work in the fields there. They assured the organization that they would arrange for Juba to speak with her **son** in the evening. Eventually, contact was made with Juba's son, but he did not understand Hindi. However, with the help of an **acquaintance**, **communication** became possible.

Two days later, Juba was finally able to speak with her son. After their conversation, her relatives assured the organization that they would come to take her home. However, there was no response from them for a few days. Finally, on **January 18, 2025**, Juba's son, **Taposh Murmu,** and her nephew, **Lakshmi Ram Murmu,** arrived at Anandamayi Vijay Mandir to take her home.

At the time of the **reunion**, Juba was **overjoyed** to recognize her son and nephew. She happily agreed to go with them. Her entire family was extremely happy and grateful for the efforts of the organization "Sapna."

Her address was found to be "P. Narayanpur, Bahir Khand, Hudali, West Bengal, PIN - 712405." This entire story reflects that with the right efforts and dedication, no obstacle is too big to overcome.

#### <u>माँ का प्यार: 17 साल बाद हुई अद्भुत मुलाकात</u>



गम भरी आँखों और खोई हुई यादों के साथ, **रोमती** मई 2024 में **आनंदमयी - ए होम फॉर होमलेस, विजय मंदिर** में आई थी। दिल्ली के **ट्रॉमा सेंटर** से आई इस 50 वर्षीय महिला की मानसिक स्थिति ठीक नहीं थी। वह अपने अतीत को भूल चुकी थी, पहचान खो चुकी थी, और जीवन की राह से भटक गई थी। लेकिन आनंदमयी में आने के बाद उसका इलाज शुरू हुआ, और धीरे-धीरे उसकी हालत में सुधार दिखने लगा।

समय बीतता गया, और एक दिन आनंदमयी के डिप्टी इंचार्ज अविनाश से बात करते हुए रोमती ने अपने घर के बारे में कुछ अधूरी यादें साझा कीं। फिर अविनाश ने रोमती के बारे में जितेन्द्र और रिहान (IT Executive, Sapna IT Team) को बताया। फिर उन्होंने रोमती से बात की तो उसने बताया कि वह जबलपुर के पास स्थित घनशोर, अमोदा खमरिया गाँव की रहने वाली है। उसके परिवार के लोग खेतों में काम करते थे, उसके पित का नाम शोभाराम हैं और उसका एक बेटा भी हैं। उसने उसका नाम दिनेश बताया। वह जब घर से निकली थी, तब बेटा सिर्फ 10 साल का था।

#### खोई पहचान की तलाश

रोमती का घर ढूँढने के लिए हमने Google Street View की मदद ली, लेकिन जब उसे गाँव की गलियाँ और मकान दिखाए गए, तो वह कुछ भी पहचान नहीं पाई। यह सफर मुश्किल था, लेकिन हमने कोशिश नहीं हारी | Google Street View पर खोजते हुए हमें एक कृषि बीज केंद्र की दुकान दिखी। उसके बोर्ड पर दुकानदार का फोन नंबर लिखा था। हमने तुरंत उस नंबर पर कॉल किया और रोमती के बारे में जानकारी साझा की। दुकानदार ने बताया कि कई साल पहले गाँव से एक महिला लापता हुई थी जिसके पित का नाम शोभा बताया, लेकिन वह पूरी तरह आश्वस्त नहीं था इसलिए उसने हमे दिनेश के फ़ोन नंबर साझा किये। फिर हमने दिनेश को कॉल किया और उसकी माँ के बारे में पूछा तो दिनेश ने बताया उसकी माँ पिछले 17 सालो से लापता हैं। फिर रोमती के बारे में हमने बताया तो उसने हमसे रोमती की एक फोटो भेजने को कहा।



जब हमने रोमती की तस्वीर भेजी, तो वह फोटो पहचाने में असमर्थ था क्योंकि वह उस वक्त सिर्फ 10 साल का था जब उसकी माँ खो गई थी इसलिए उसने अपने मामा श्याम से संपर्क किया और फोटो भेजा। श्याम, जो रोमती का भाई था, ने उसे तुरंत पहचान लिया।

#### 17 साल बाद माँ-बेटे का मिलन

श्याम ने तुरंत जितेन्द्र और रिहान (IT Executive, Sapna IT Team) से संपर्क किया और उनसे अनुरोध किया कि वे रोमती से वीडियो कॉल पर बात करवाएँ।

जब वीडियो कॉल पर रोमती और श्याम आमने-सामने आए, तो दोनों की आँखों से आँसू छलक पड़े। दोनों जोर-जोर से रोने लगे। यह मिलन किसी चमत्कार से कम नहीं था।

इतने में **दिनेश** भी धीरे-धीरे अपनी माँ की छिव को पहचानने लगा। पहले उसे यकीन नहीं हुआ, लेकिन जब उसने माँ की आवाज सुनी, उसकी आँखें नम हो गईं, और वह भी रो पड़ा। वर्षों बाद, एक बेटे ने अपनी माँ को पाया, और एक भाई ने अपनी बहन को।

#### विजय मंदिर में पुनर्मिलन का भावुक क्षण

आज, 6 फरवरी, दिनेश और श्याम विजय मंदिर पहुँचे। जैसे ही रोमती ने अपने बेटे और भाई को देखा, वह दौड़कर उनके गले लग गई। वर्षों का इंतजार, अनिगनत दर्द और खोए हुए लम्हे—सब कुछ उन आँसुओं में बहने लगा।

रोमती के भाई श्याम ने बताया कि उन्होंने पाँच साल तक अपनी बहन को ढूँढने की कोशिश की थी, लेकिन जब कुछ पता नहीं चला तो उन्होंने उम्मीद छोड़ दी थी। पर किस्मत ने आज उन्हें वह खुशी दी, जिसका उन्होंने कभी सपना भी नहीं देखा था।

#### माँ का प्यार कभी नहीं खोता

एक माँ का प्यार ऐसा ही होता है—17 साल बीत गए, लेकिन उसकी ममता कभी कम नहीं हुई। दिनेश के लिए भी यह दिन अविस्मरणीय था। जब वह 10 साल का था, तब उसकी माँ उससे बिछड़ गई थी, लेकिन आज वह 27 साल का युवक अपनी माँ को फिर से अपने साथ ले जाने के लिए खड़ा था।

यह मिलन सिर्फ **रोमती**, दिनेश और श्याम के लिए नहीं, बल्कि हम सभी के लिए एक अद्भुत और अविश्वसनीय क्षण था।

#### A Success Story of Cataract Surgery



Ramphal Yadav, a 72-year-old farmer from Peela Dhawa village in Alwar, Rajasthan, had been living a hardworking and active life. But slowly, things started to change. His eyesight began to blur because of cataracts. Over time, it got so bad that he could only see fingers held close to his face. Simple daily work like farming, taking care of his goats and cattle, became very difficult. He started feeling helpless and lost his confidence.

Then one day, Ramphal attended a **free eye check-up** camp organized by NGO Sapna. The doctors from **Mahatma Gandhi Netralaya** checked his eyes and told him he needed **cataract surgery.** 

With trust in their advice, he agreed to the **operation**. The surgery was a big success. His eyesight **improved** to **6/12**, and it felt like light had **returned** to his life.

Now, Ramphal is **back to** doing all his work. He goes to the market on his own, works in the fields, and happily talks with people in his village. Most importantly, he has regained his confidence.

In his words: "The restoration of my eyesight has transformed my life. I can now live just like before." His journey shows that with the right support, life can shine bright again.

#### • Baksar's New Vision: A Journey from Darkness to Light

Baksar, a 70-year-old homemaker, lives with her full family, including two sons and grandchildren. For many years, she suffered from poor eyesight due to cataracts. Her right eye became so weak that she could only count fingers from one meter away. Daily tasks like cooking, recognizing family members, stitching clothes, and walking alone became very difficult. She had always taken care of her family, but as her eyesight got worse, she lost her confidence and had to depend on others—even to go to the mosque



Then came a moment of hope. With the help of NGO Sapna, she went to a **free eye check-up** camp organized by Mahatma Gandhi Netralaya. The doctors **checked her eyes** and **advised** her to have **cataract surgery**. Her husband Rahman fully supported her, and with his help, she agreed to the surgery.

The **operation** was a **success.** The very next day, Baksar could see **clearly again**—her vision became **6/6p**. It felt like she had gotten her world back.

Now, Baksar is independent again. She cooks for her family, manages the house, and goes to the mosque on her own. Her **confidence** and **happiness** have returned. She now tells other women not to be afraid of cataracts, because with treatment, life can become **bright again.**
