Sapno Ka Ghar - 04



Sapno ka Ghar has been constructed for the poorest of the poor families. The project aims at supporting economically disadvantaged families allowing them to build a sustainable lifestyle for themselves. The project has been instrumental in sheltering them, improving hygiene and safety of the families.

Story of Sahun - A ray of hope.

The 4th sapno ka ghar is under construction. It is estimated to be completed in September 2025. The beneficiary for this term is Sahun, a resident of vweillage Kaduki. A daily wage laborer, he resides with his family of 7 in a mud constructed house with major problem of roof leakage. The family of Rs. 6000/ month leaves them with limited options to improve their condition. Sapno ka ghar project has kindled hopes in their hearts with real promise of change.

Highlights

- **The economic conditions of the beneficiary family of 7 members is weak, as they earn Rs 6000/month.**
- **They currently reside in a mud house, that is prone to heavy rainfall and other extreme whether conditions.**

Goat Rearing Project



In March 2022, NGO Sapna initiated the Goat Rearing Livelihood Program with the objective of improving the annual income impoverished families. The Objective of the project is to enhance Livelihood and income, promote Women empowerment as social impact and ensure nutritional benefits through milk production.

Highlights

- **Number of goats expired during the quarter - 4 in May**
- **Number of FMD Foot and Mouth diseases vaccination received by goats - 98 in June**
- **Total number of villages covered by the project - 10 in June**

Kitchen Garden (June)



This project aims to achieve better nutrition and health at the household level. Active participation and beneficiary status of women are heavily emphasized. Beneficiaries are selected based on the availability of an open plot near the house and their interest.



Highlights

- **A kitchen garden awareness session was organized on 19th May, where 7 women showed interest in the project**
- **10 beneficiaries have been benefitted in the first quarter on 1st June.**

Tree Plantation drive (June)



NGO Sapna is committed towards building harmonious environment with nature. We began tree plantation drive in 2017 in rural Alwar. Planting a sapling costs around Rs. 1500, including pre planting steps such as digging to maintenance of water source - drip water pipeline.



Highlights

- **943 saplings planted in Dadhikar, Bala Dahra, Nandanheri and Kaduki**
- **90% survival rate till end of June has been recorded**
- **Two types of trees were planted - Shady: Amaltas, Kachnar, Kadamb, Neem, Shisham, Kada Badam, Gulmohar and Fruit: Lemon, Mausambi, Chikoo, Amrood, Mango**

NGO Sapna aims to protect the environment and improve human health by promoting hygienic practices at the household level. Since 2015, we have been constructing individual toilets in villages around Vijay Mandir and Dadikar in Alwar, with the vision of ensuring every household has access to a toilet. Till date, 225 individual toilets have been built, significantly reducing open defecation and its harmful effects. In FY 2025, households marked in green have already received toilet facilities, while those marked in red will soon benefit through our ongoing efforts in partnership with Bry Air (Asia) Pvt. Ltd. During this quarter, construction of 15 toilets was undertaken, out of which 10 have been completed and 5 are currently in progress.

Anandam & Anandmayee: A home for the homeless



The first quarter of 2025 (April, May and June), continued with their dedicated efforts of supporting from 150 - 175 patients each month in terms of medical care, nutrition and rehabilitation.

153 patients were staying at homeless center across in April 2025.

In May 2025, patient strength remained steady at 151. There were 20 new admissions and 14 patients sent home, while 2 individuals were rehabilitated. Five coma patients continued under treatment. However, 1 patient death was recorded.

By June 2025, the patient load rose to 174 – the highest this quarter – reflecting 24 new admissions across centers. Though only 5 patients were discharged, 14 were successfully rehabilitated to other homes, indicating stronger transition support.

Highlights

- **No patient deaths were recorded in April. A total of 27 OPDs were conducted and 23 community lunches organized**
- **May also saw increased outreach, with 24 OPDs and 48 lunches organized – the highest community engagement in the quarter.**
- **Three coma patients were under intensive care, while 3 patient deaths were reported. Medical and community activities continued strongly, with 40 OPDs and 32 lunches organized.**



Anandmayee: Vijay Mandir

Anandamayee Vijay Mandir reported 5 patients that returned to their families from April 2024 - August 2025. These patients were suffering from trauma or were left by their family member at the facility. The NGO attempts to advice family member to not give up the care of their traumatized member of the family. The case of Phool bai is similar to the issue. There are other cases as well where active search of NGO pays off and the identities along with families of the patients are traced. Some of the cases are given below:-

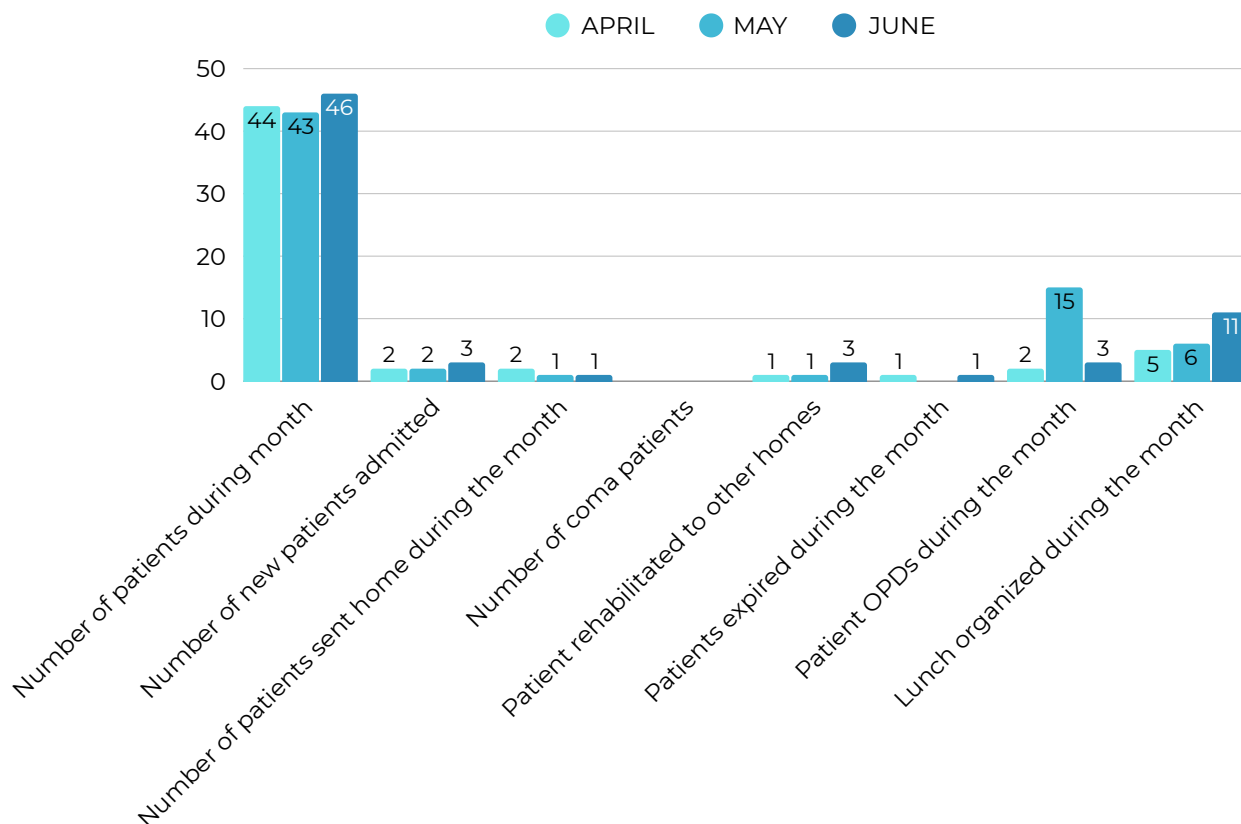

These people are also victims of trauma or are reported missing in the police records. their families have been frantically searching from them. NGO Sapna has acts as a key link to take care, identify and track the residence of these people. Some patients who have been united with their families are provided below:-

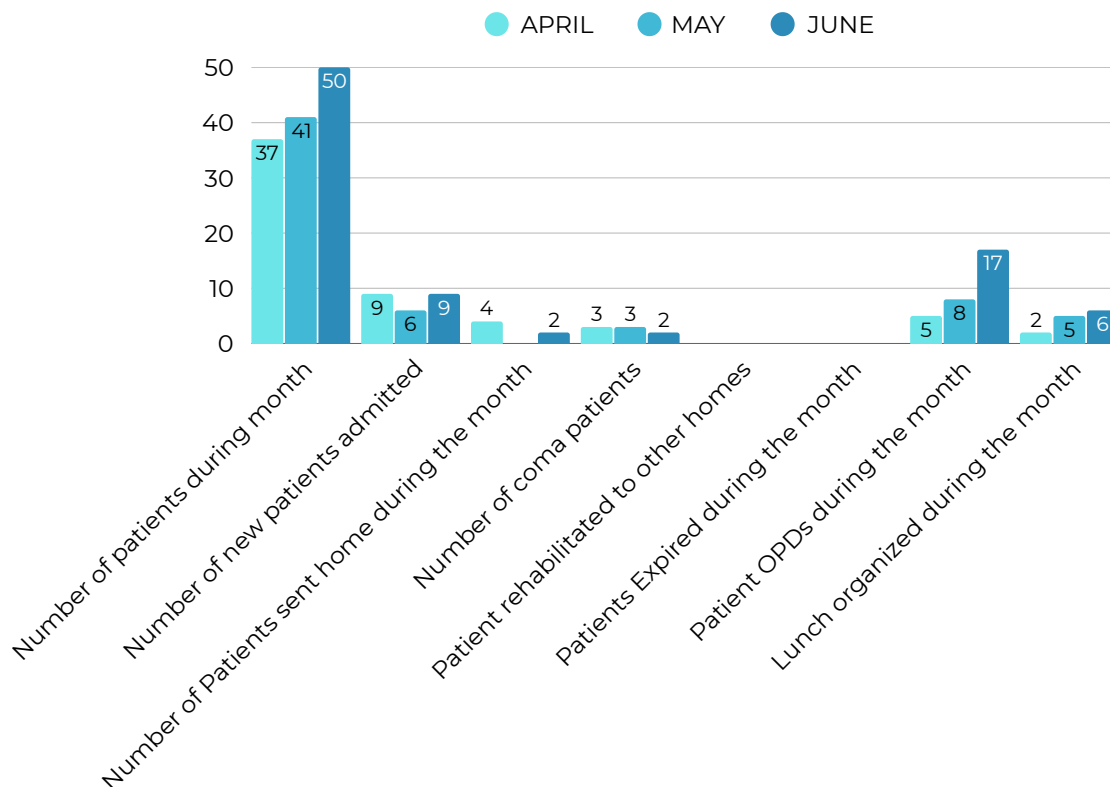

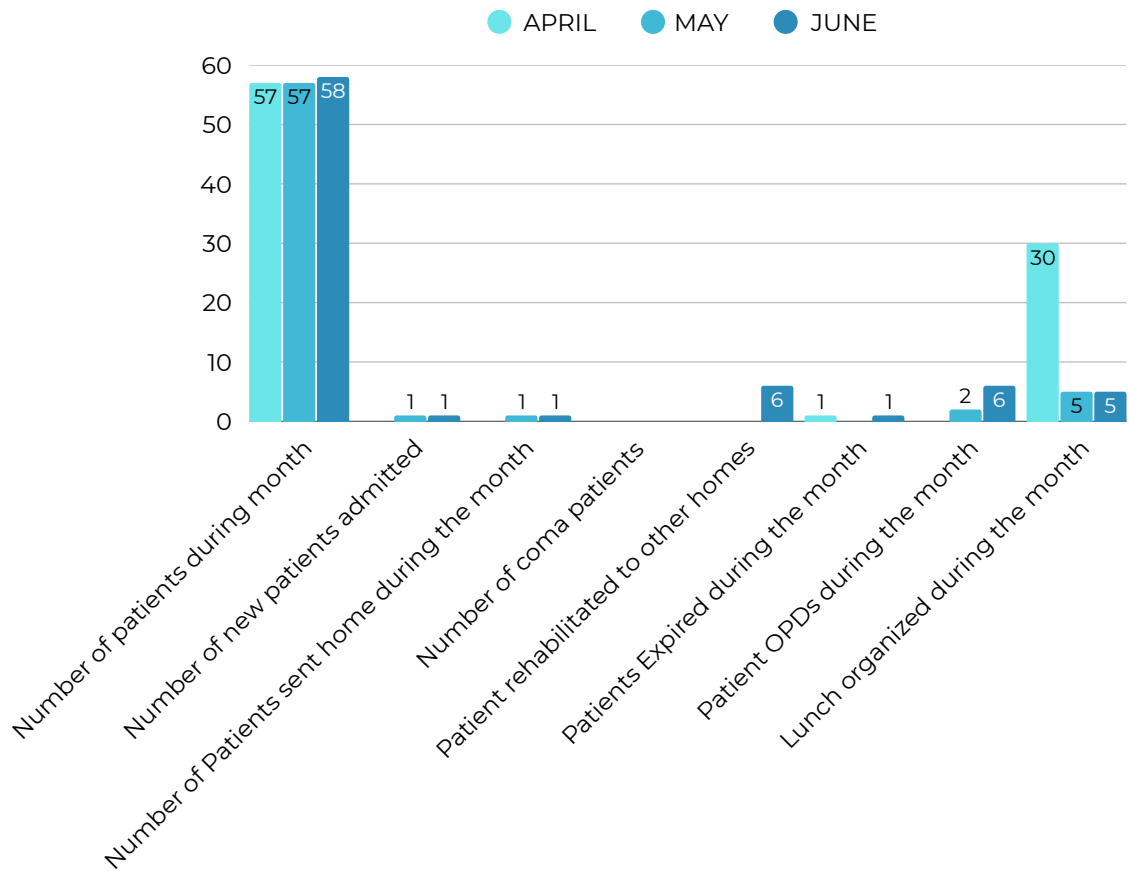

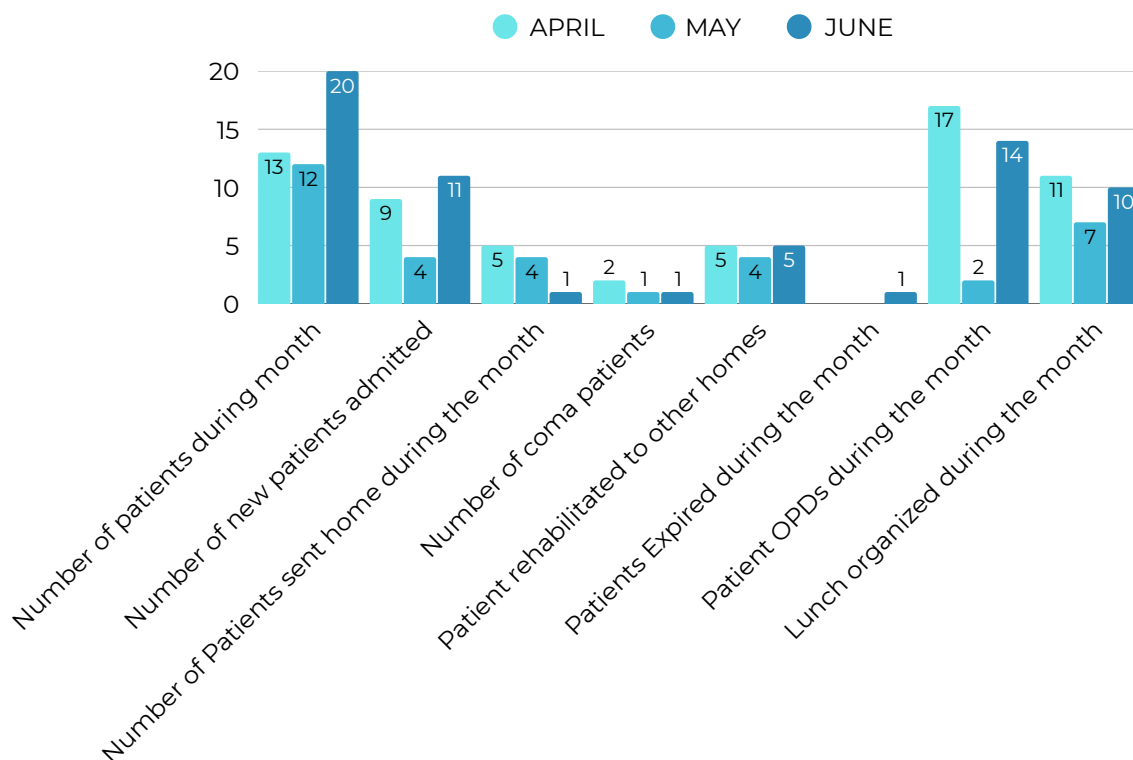

The quarter witnessed steady academic engagement, cultural celebrations, and strong participation in both curricular and co-curricular activities at Sapna Shikshalaya.

In April 2025, the school had 319 girls enrolled, including 26 new admissions.

- Events celebrated - Baishakhi, World Art Day, Earth Day, World Heritage Day, along with nominations for the School Council.
- Students showcased their knowledge through the Jigyasa Inter-School Quiz Competition.

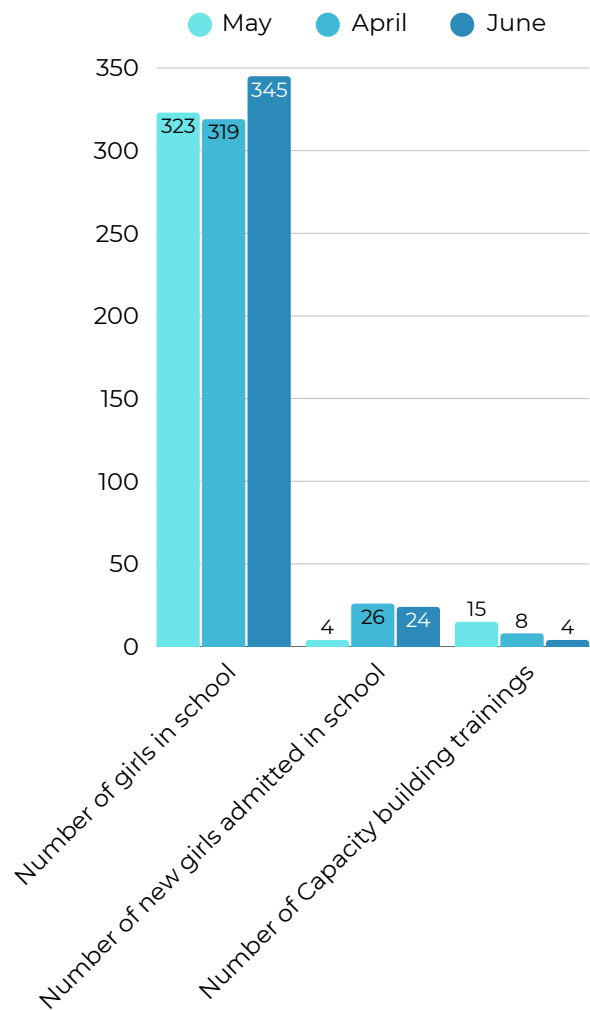
During May 2025, total enrollment rose to 323 girls, with four new admissions.

- Key events - Labour Day, Orientation Day, Mother's Day, and a Summer Camp (19th–21st May).
- A Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) was organized on 17th May, further strengthening school-parent interactions.

In June 2025, total enrollment reached 345 girls, boosted by 24 new admissions.

- However, the school also recorded eight dropouts, bringing the total dropout number to 27.
- Summer Camp was organized on 24th and 30th June, focusing on holistic development and engagement during the vacation period.

- **Similarly, June** included four capacity-building trainings and was marked by the celebration of International Yoga Day (21st June).

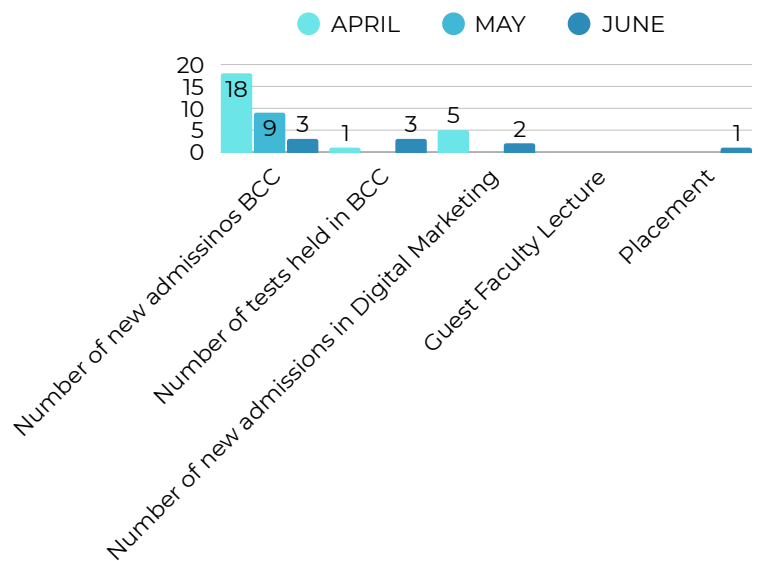
Sapna IT College: RS-CIT, Accounts + GST & Basic Computer Course



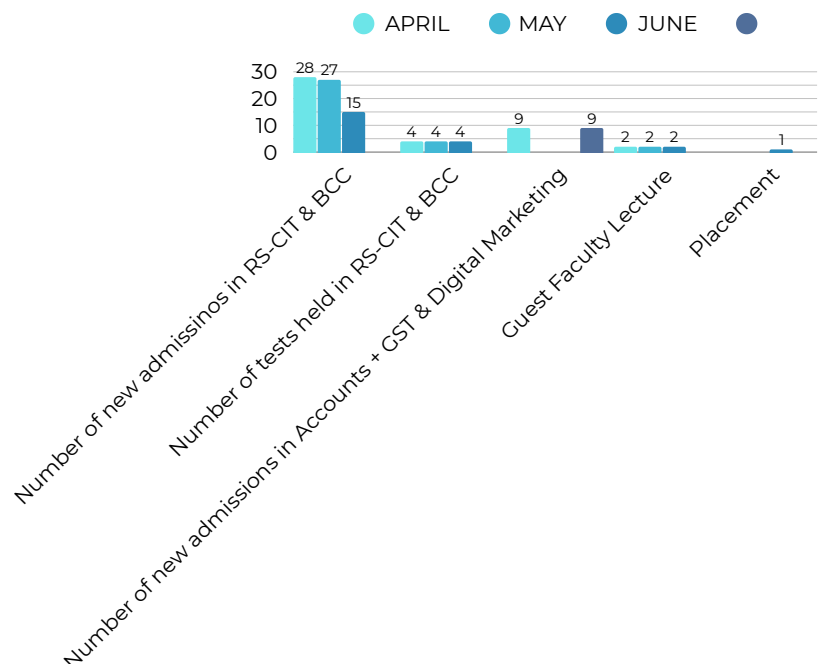
RS-CIT course leads the admission numbers by 100 pupil, than digital marketing course which accounts 16 students across the two centers. April witnessed increase 9 admissions to the digital marketing course at Vijay Mandir while 2 admissions were reported at the Noida center. Overall the course recorded 2 placements across the centers. They were namely placed at Bajaj Finance Alwar. To uphold the quality of studies, Vijay Mandir attempts to arrange guest faculty for the students. Quarter 1 reported 6 guest faculty visit at Vijay Mandir center.

To maintain a track of learning progress of the students, the courses RS-CIT and BCC courses holds regular tests. This quarter, Vijay Mandir held 21 test, while the Noida center also held 4 tests.

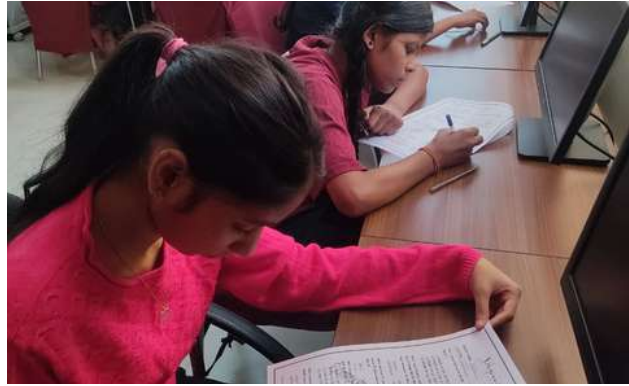

Computer Literacy Center - Noida



A Computer Literacy Center was established in Nithari, Noida on 25th December 2023 with the support of Tata Power Community Development Trust & Powerlinks Transmission Limited. The project aims to support a Computer Literacy Center (CLC) in Nithari, Noida to provide digital literacy and IT skills to marginalized communities, particularly disadvantaged women & girls.

The CLC course has trained 135 student in total from April 2024 to March 2025. As per the latest statistics, 125 students have successfully passed the final exams.

A UPSC aspirant with a strong interest in science, Rashmi is an inspired young girl.

She has gained valuable skills such as digital marketing, formal emailing, product designing by joining CLC course. This has equipped her with necessary skills to strengthen her formal communications enabling her to put forth her case proudly and purposefully regardless of her career choices in future.

Mahatma Gandhi Netralaya (MGN)



Across April, May, and June, a total of 1,025 patients availed paid OPD services, while outreach OPD reached 2,270 patients, reflecting the hospital's ongoing commitment to providing affordable eye care to the wider community.

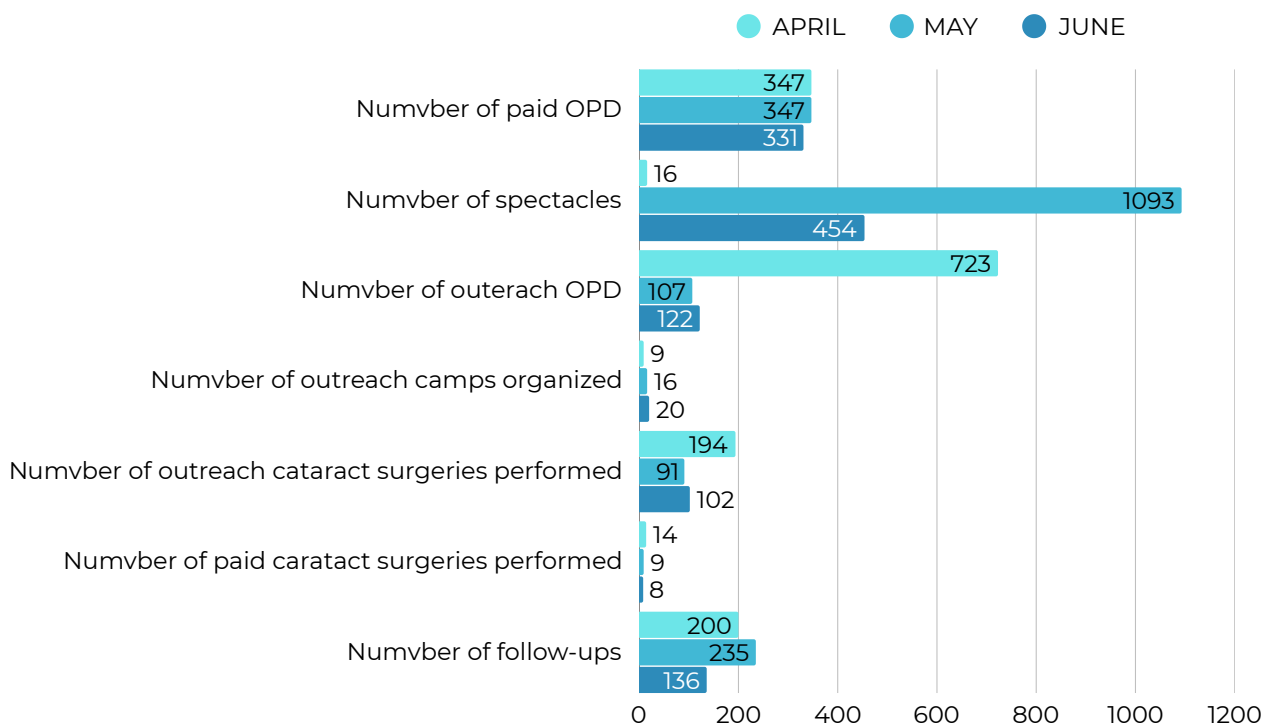
Surgical interventions formed a crucial part of the quarter's activities. MGN successfully conducted 423 cataract surgeries, out of which 50 were paid and the rest performed under outreach programs. This balance highlights MGN's dual focus on serving the underprivileged while also sustaining through paid services.

Spectacle distribution was another key activity. Over the three months, 111 spectacles were provided, ensuring improved post-treatment vision outcomes for beneficiaries. Outreach remained strong with the organization of 26 camps across different locations, facilitating greater access to rural and underserved populations.

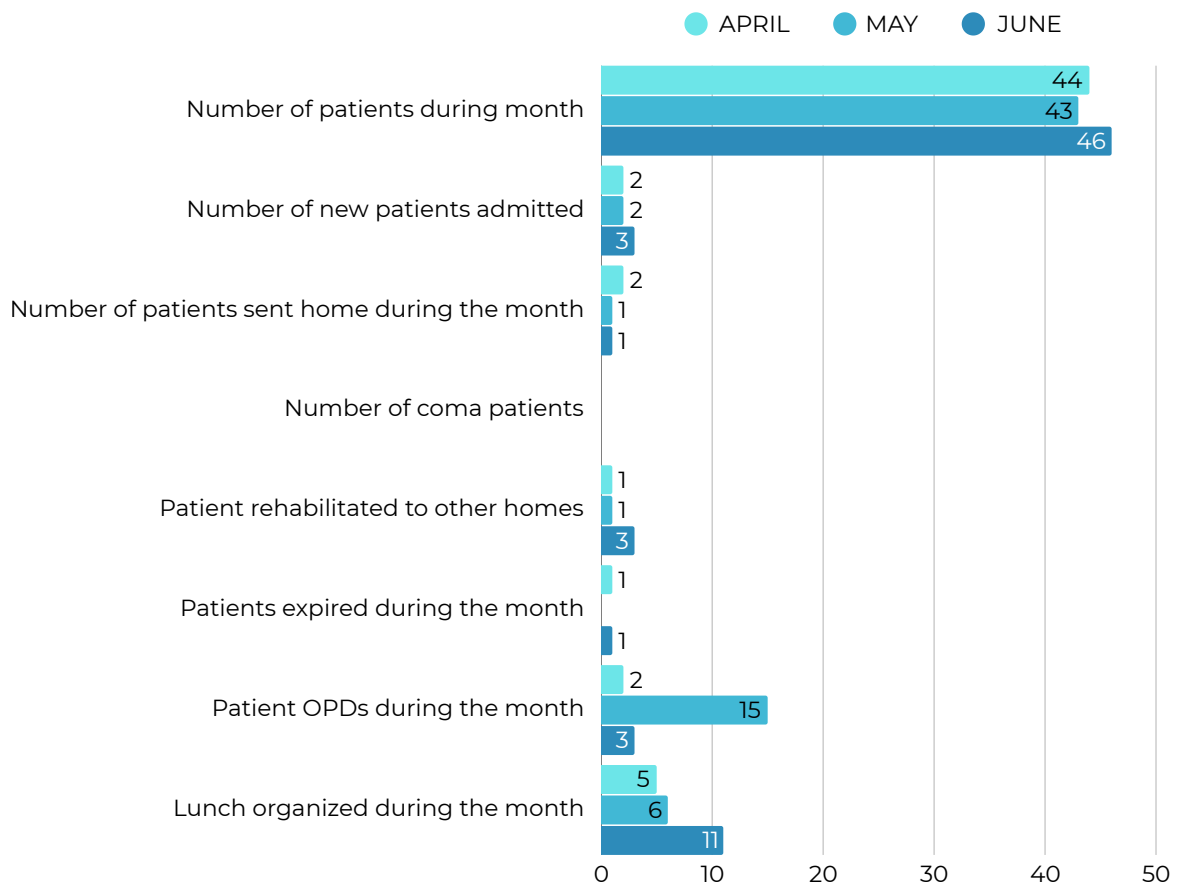

Jai Prakash Narayan Apex Trauma Center of AIIMS



At JPNA Trauma Center of AIIMS, we provide support to unclaimed/unknown trauma victims who are in need of critical medical care: nursing care, pre and post surgery needs, ambulance services, nutritional support and rehabilitation. The Trauma center serves as the nodal point to identify and transfer trauma patients to the care of NGO Sapna at our homeless centers. The JPNA Trauma center also distributes ortho aid in partnership with NGO Sapna.

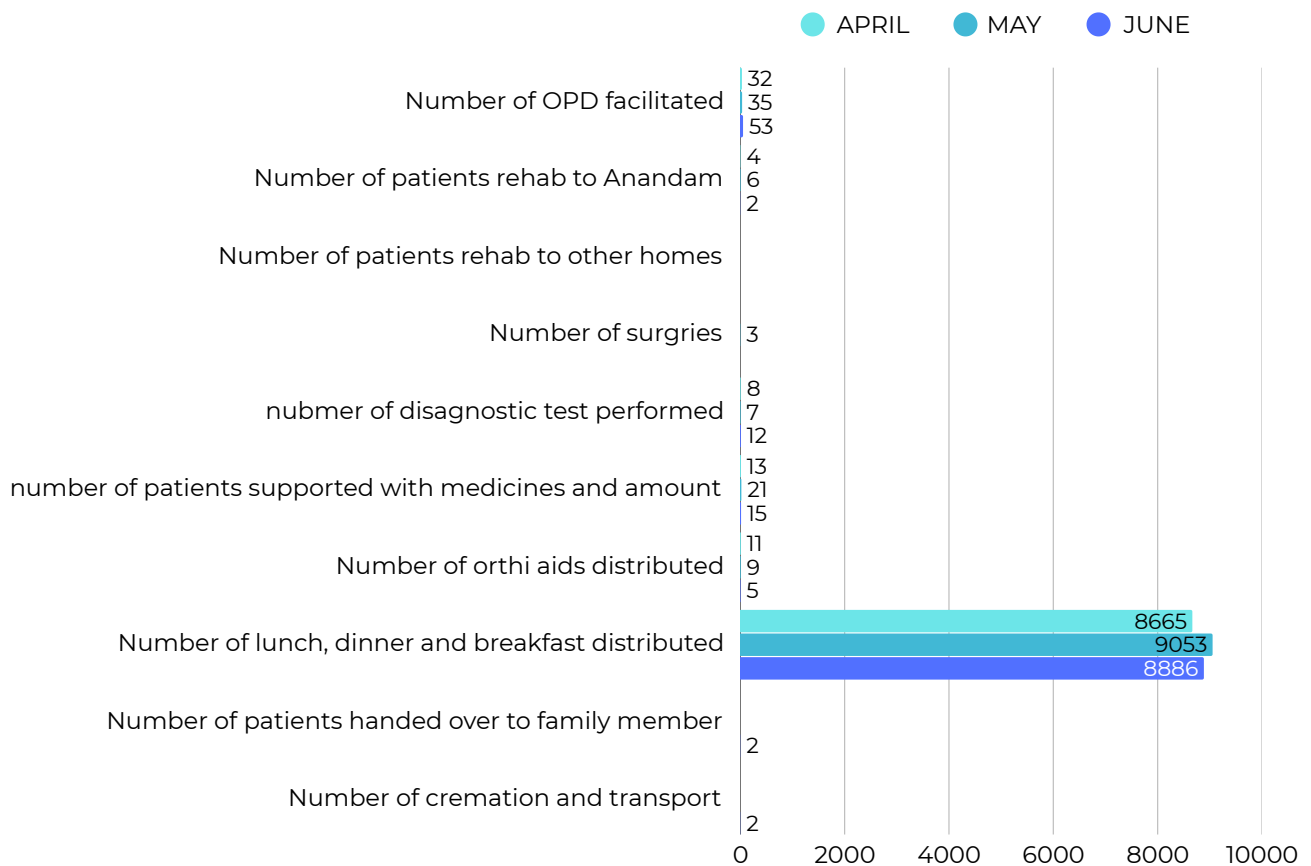

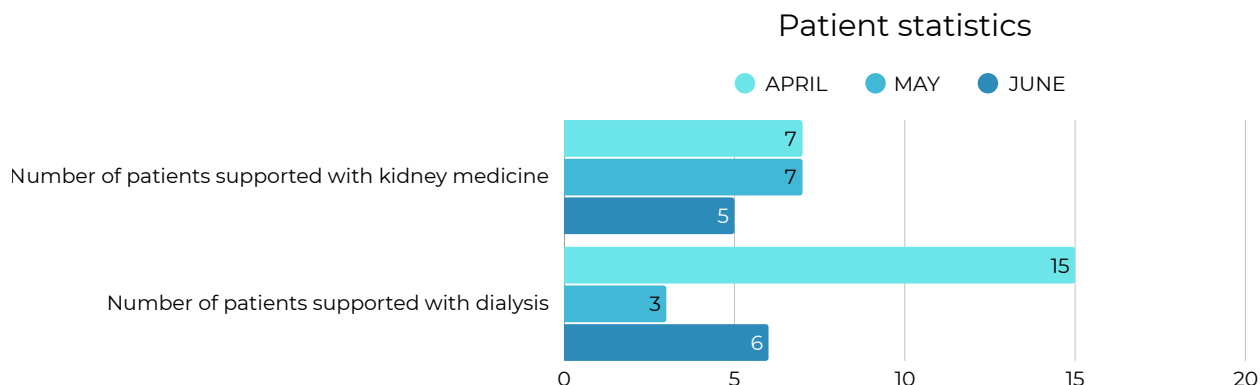

Support to Kidney Patients

NGO Sapna supports poor people to suffering from kidney ailment or those who have undergone kidney transplant surgery. Significant number of patients belong from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. They seek treatment at AIIMS while staying at Rajgarhea Vishram Sadan.



Highlights

- Sapna provides medical support worth of Ra. 5000 - Rs. 10,000 / month.
- Total number of patients supported with Kidney medicine - 19 as well as 24 patients were supported with dialysis.

Cancer Patients



NGO Sapna has supported 6 cancer patients with tests and medicines. Cancer tends to put financial as well as mental strain on the patients and their families. NGO Sapna has dedicated its services to help them by spending Rs. 45000 in month of June 2025 alone.

Case study

Shanti Devi a 50 year old lady and skin cancer patient, received chemo therapy at Safdarjung hospital. The social service counter of NGO Sapna at Safdarjung has been able to financially assist her with total amount approximating to Rs. 14,000 - Rs. 15,000. This includes Rs. 10,000 for test and Rs. 4,000 -5,000 for medicines. This help gave her to go through the expensive treatment. She hopes to emerge a victor in the battle against cancer.

Mahila Suraksha Evam Salah Kendra (MSSK)

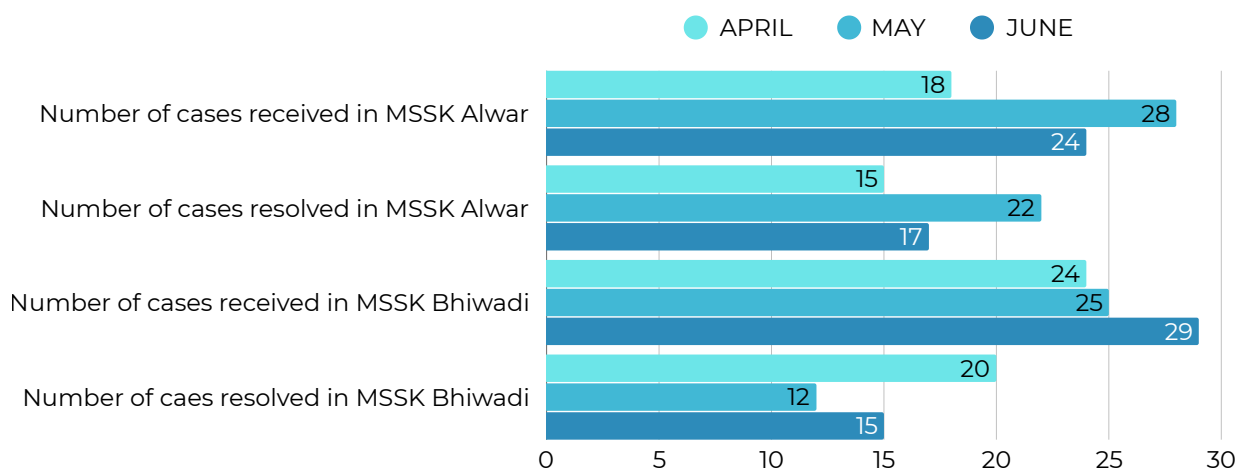

In reducing the violence against women, 'Mahila Suraksha Evam Salah Kendra (MSSK)', a holistic redressal center for women has been operational since 2008 by partnering with local police and Department of Women and Child in Alwar, Rajasthan. We have also opened a branch in Bhiwadi to expand our reach.

Kajal - A story of Resilience

Kajal, a 17 year old girl visited MSSK on 14th April 2025, to intimate about the choice of her parents to get her married against her wishes. While she wishes to study ahead, she asks the MSSK worker to kindly convince her parent to continue her studies and drop the idea of marriage. As the worker assures her, Kajal fears that such counsel will not be enough to convince her parents. Plus her parents will take her home and she emphasizes her wish not to return back home. The MSSK worker accordingly dealt with the situation by providing her the contact of child helpline number 1098. The worker advice her to visit the office of Bal Adhikari. She thanked the MSSK center for hearing her issue and guiding her to right authorities.

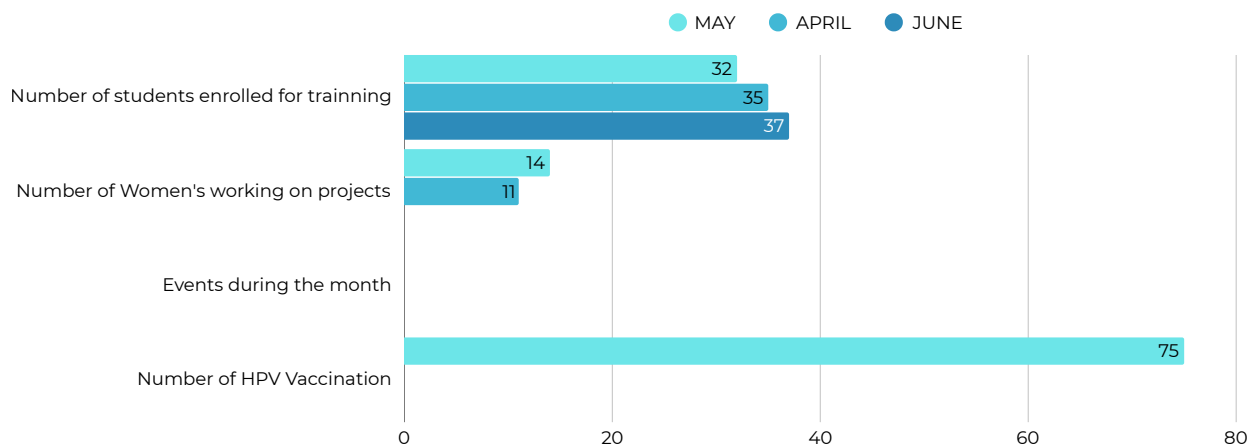
