PATIENTS & FAMILIES



Mobin age 65 years, is a resident of Vallabgarh, Uttar Pradesh. As habitual drinker, he wandered off from the house under the pretext of getting himself checked to the doctor. Mobin lives with his nephew, Mahendra. With no family, his wife passed away early in life Mobin used to work at the general store owned by Mahendra. Upon the failure of his return, Mahendra began his search with no luck. Meanwhile, after sustaining leg fracture, Mobin was released from AIIMS Trauma Center on 30 August 2024, he was then transferred to NGO Sapna Kaduki Center. After, recovery and questioning Sapna social workers contacted Mahindra who happily reunited with him. They left for home on 2nd November, 2025.

Vikki a resident of Rampur, Uttar Pradesh aged 25 years was found by police from Vijay Mandir Chauki, wandering in Rund Shahpur aimlessly on 8th November, 2025.

He was then handed over to NGO Sapna on 20th November 2025. Upon receiving necessary medical care related to depression as prescribed by the doctors, he was questioned about his identity. He then briefed the staff about his hometown in Uttar Pradesh. His uncle was duly contacted who reached the Kaduki center on 22nd November 2025. His uncle, thrilled after receiving the news, left his job to reach Alwar! They thanked the center for this gift and returned home the same day.





Case studies

PATIENTS & FAMILIES



Radha, aged 40 years old a resident of Haldina Alwar suffered Psychosis. She was handed over to the Anandmayee center Vijay Mandir by Jai Ram Chaudry along with another person named Manager on 26th April 2024.

Her prevailing condition lead her to have fits and her unrestrained, often “irritating” behavior or activities as described by Jai Ram. After over a year, Jai Ram came to collect her, claiming to be her husband. This news shocked the staff. Meanwhile, Radha began to recover Upon thorough inspection and inquiry into his background, Radha was handed over to him on 22.11.2025.

Rajiv Gandhi Manohar Chikitsalaya Alwar called NGO Sapna for a women named Kanchan aged 31 years. She was found to have on family. Upon contact, her sister and brother-in-law came to visit. She was handed over by her family to Sapna. In her medical records, Kanchan was diagnosed with catatonic schizophrenia and post-partum depression psychosis. As she faced demanding circumstances of her 2nd marriage and separation from children from her 1st marriage, she began to recover at the center from August of 2025. Slowly, Kanchan regained her speech ability and began interacting with people around her. Meanwhile, she was visited by court authorities to keep a check. However, her relentless pursual to return to her mother drove NGO Sapna to reconnect her. Post visit by her mother and elder sister on 25th December 2025 and claiming all the necessary permissions from police and court, Kanchan was seen off by the NGO along with her mother on 26th December 2025 at 1:30 pm.





Case studies

PATIENTS & FAMILIES



Pushpa aged 55 years, a resident of Gajuka Thana, Alwar wandered off from her home and found by Female constable Punam Kumari at night near the highway. She was then transferred by the police to NGO Sapna on 4th December 2025.

On 5th December her family including her son, daughter and daughter-in-law reached the Kaduki center. They told the center that she had been missing from the house since 4-5 days. Police called them about her whereabouts at NGO Sapna. They remarked “तो हम माताजी का घर लेने आ गए।” The family thanked NGO Sapna for giving their mother shelter, as they made their way to home together as whole again!

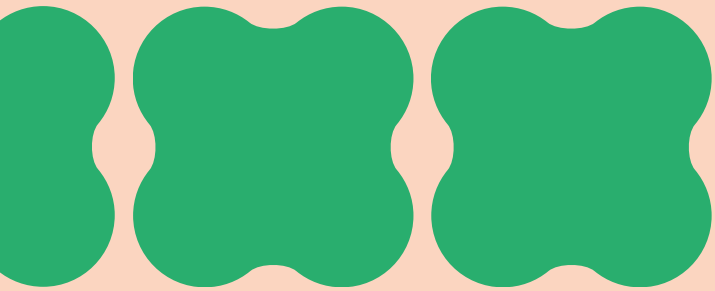
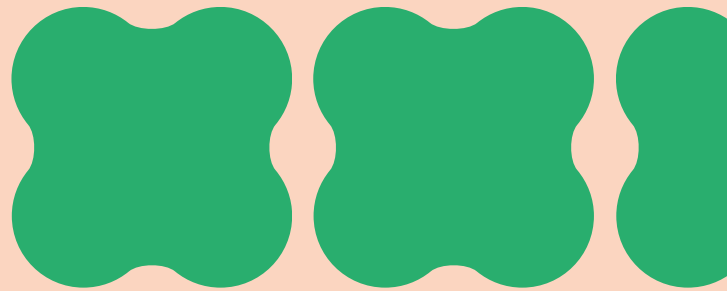
Unknown patient was admitted to Safdarjung hospital in dire state. He was incapable to brief the hospital staff about his identity or his residence. Later he was transferred to NGO Sapna on 27th July 2025, by the police and hospital team. Here, he was looked after by the social workers, slowly regaining his health. Nearly 4 months later after consistent treatment he fully recovered and began interacting with people around him.

Then he briefed the social workers about his name as Mintiaz Pathan, mother's name as Anjum Aara and Father's name as Jan Mohammad as well as his home in Tirampur Thana, Purni Delhi. The staff contacted his family and on 25th December 2025, he was transported to his home by Sapna in the car accompanied by social worker Rafiq from Noida center to his home. Family thanked NGO Sapna for their invaluable efforts in reuniting them with their son!

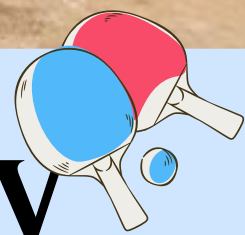
- Sapna Shikshalaya celebrated Sports Day in the cherished memory of Late Dr Suresh Khandelwal at **Vijay Mandir**.

PATIENTS & FAMILIES



Anmol, aged 12 years suffered from life altering accident in April 2025. Belonging from a small village Badhiya, he used to be a bright school going student in 3rd grade when tragedy stroke. His father, working as an agricultural laborer brought him to Safdarjung hospital for treatment. Anmol underwent operation in October 2025. The operation was carried out wit the financial assistance of Sapna NGO supporting the fixator implant costing Rs. 26,800/-.

Anmol's operation was a success, the doctor hopes for a recovery allowing him to mobilize again and continue his education. This is an example of timely intervention by NGO Sapna to support economically backward classes receiving quality healthcare.

Afiya, a girl resident of Mirzapur, Saharanpur, UP, was diagnosed with skin cancer 8 years ago. Now, 24 she is undergoing chemotherapy along with injections as a part of her treatment plan at Safdarjung hospital. She belongs from an economically weak social strata. She and he siblings including 4 sisters and 3 brothers lost their father 7 years ago. Despite the hardships and mounting challenges, her mother worked as a domestic worker to support Afiya's treatment and the family. She came in contact with NGO Sapna in February 2025, requesting assistance in her fight against cancer. Sapna stepped in and has now covered the cost of her 4 out of 6 injections, costing Rs. 40,000 each.

Chaub Singh, a woman in her 40s was dealing with issues in mobility. She came to Trauma center for her treatment. During her one of the visits, she was informed about Sapna NGO's program for supporting patients with ortho aids and financial aid. Financially struggling, she requested for the ortho aid. Chaub Singh was provided with one walker by the social service counter of JPNA Trauma center through the reference of of MSSO Iram ma'am. The walker has been significant player for her to regain her independence.

Shivam visited Trauma center 2 years ago. He suffered from leg injury, there he was assisted by NGO Sapna to continue his treatment. currently, he is undergoing mobility recovery wherein a was provided with a walker and medicines by the social service counter of NGO Sapna in October 2025.

Although he lives on roadside in Delhi away from home. This help has given him to recovery again. He comes for routine check up at the Trauma Center and is greeted by the social service counter of NGO Sapna!

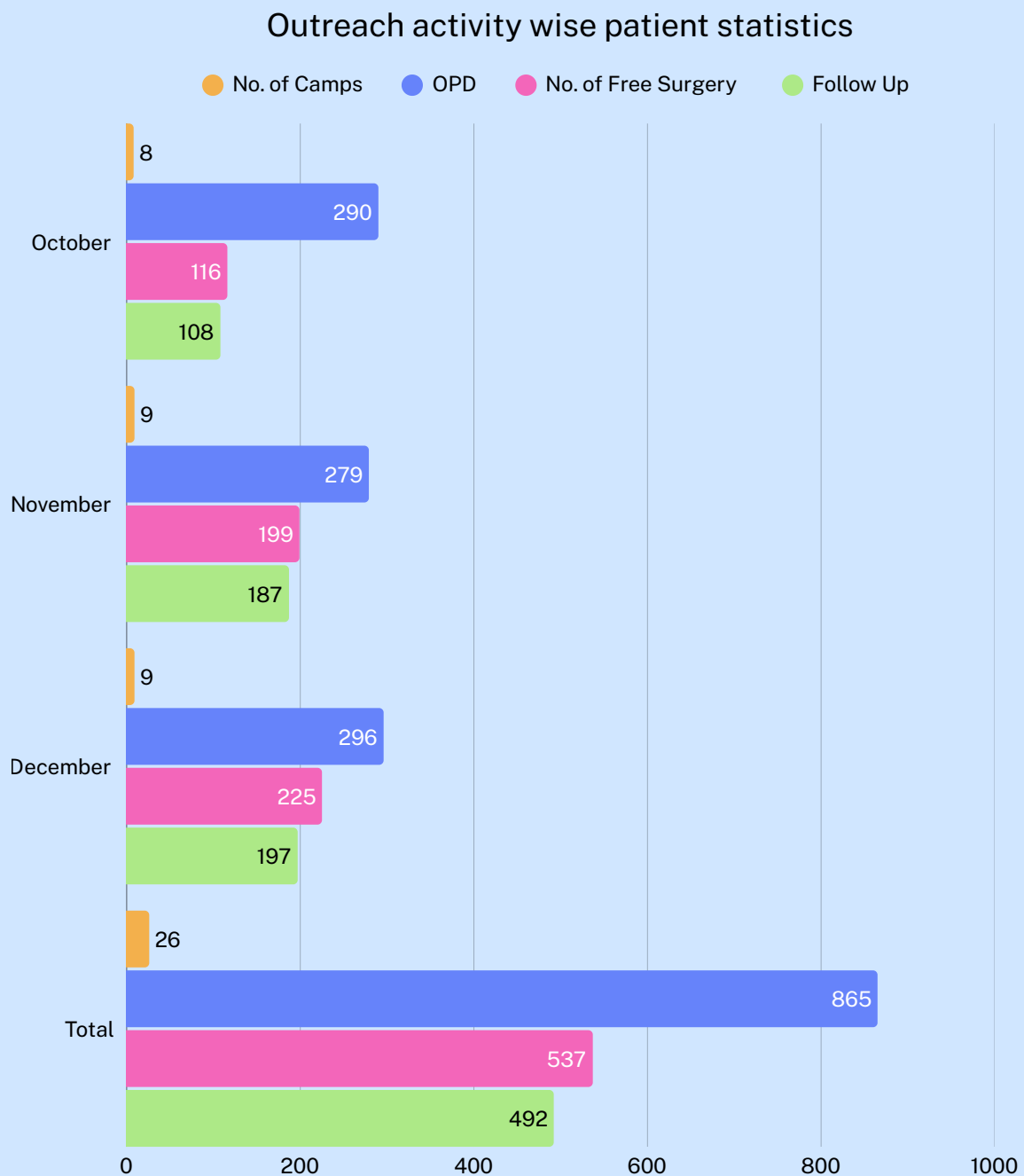

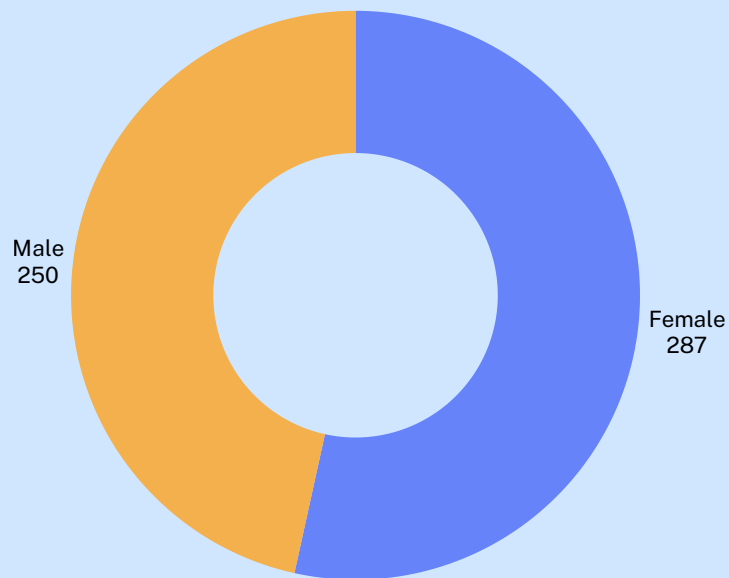

Jamila Ji was admitted on 16/10/2025, and on 17/10/2025 her right-eye cataract surgery was successfully performed. Post operation, there was excellent improvement in her vision - 6/6 from Finger Count at 2 metres.

Today, after the operation, Jamila Ji is able to see clearly and distinctly. This success story is a strong example that through the free eye check-up camps organised by MGN and timely treatment, not only the patient but the entire family can live a better life with new light.

The patient's name is Mahesh, age 44 years, resident of Bamanwas, Alwar, Rajasthan. Mahesh Ji had come to the eye check-up camp organized by Maharashtra Gandhi Netralaya (Mahatma Gandhi Netralaya). During the examination, he was diagnosed with cataract in his left eye, due to which his vision had reduced significantly. Due to poor vision, Mahesh Ji had to face considerable difficulties in his day-to-day work and family life.

Mahesh Ji was admitted on 06/11/2025, and on 07/11/2025 his left-eye cataract surgery was successfully performed. Post-operation, there was astonishing improvement in his vision - 6/6 from 6/60.

Today, after the operation, Mahesh Ji is able to see clearly without any difficulty. He is able to do his work properly after the restoration of his eyesight.

After the operation, there was remarkable improvement in his vision -6/6 from Hand Movement Close to Face (HMCF). Today, Ramswaroop Ji is able to see clearly and distinctly. This success story is proof that the free eye check-up camps organized by MGN and timely treatment brings new light and new hope into people's lives.

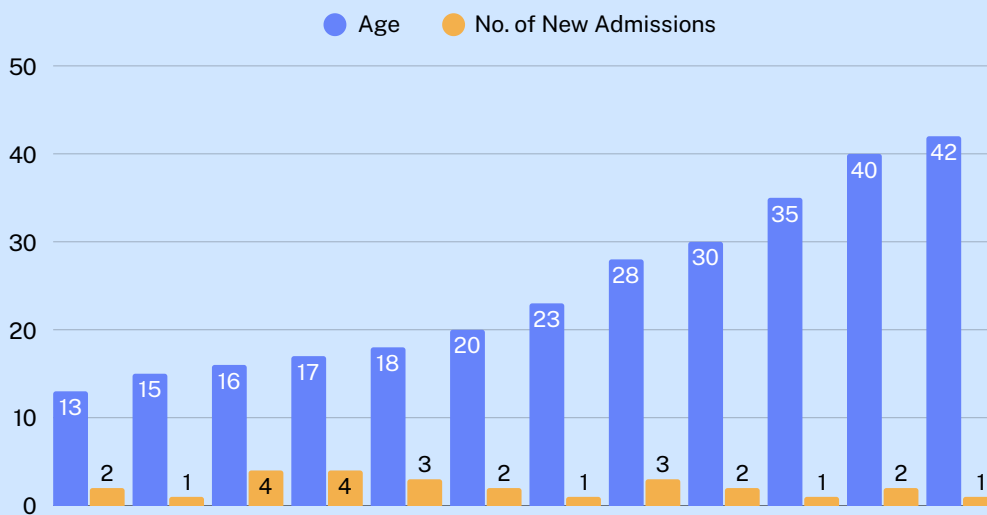

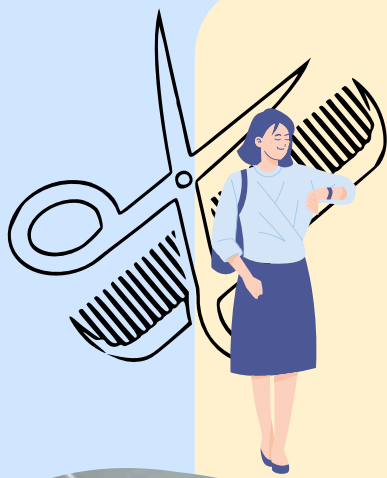

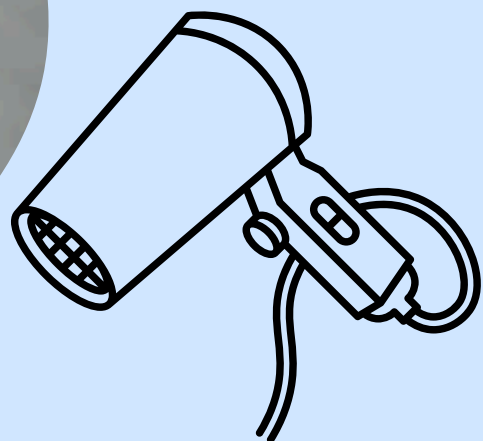

She is now working at Urban Clap as a professional, earning 80,000 to 100000/ month.

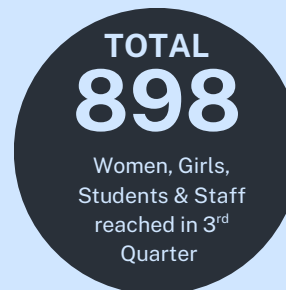

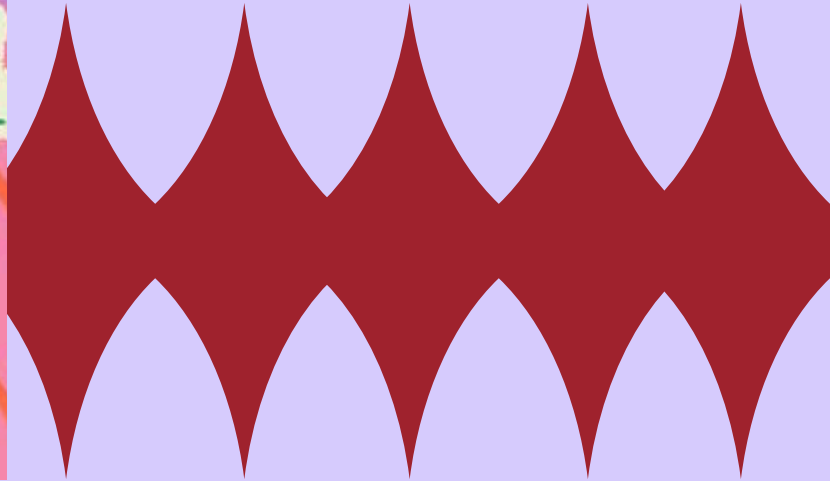


Case Studies

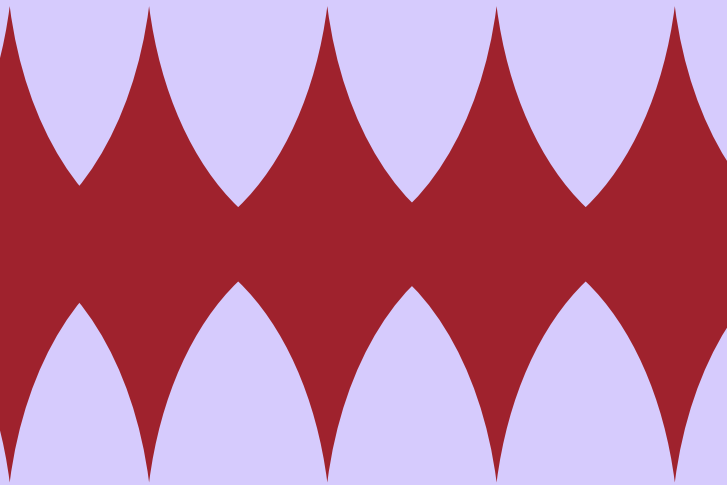
Rabina wife of Arsad, resident of village Gherbassai, Alwar. She has 5 daughters, however, she suffers from domestic violence at the hands of her husband for not having a son. Due to this, Rabina took her case to the court. Later, she visited Mahila Suraksha and Salah Kendra with her problems and discussed it with the councilor. Upon hearing, Rabina was advised to bring her husband. She revealed that her husband is both physically and verbally abused by her husband. MSSK councilor intervened in the matter and provided the couple with the platform to express their grievances with each other. Rabina and Arsad agreed to compromise and left the center in unison.



This is to state that the above-mentioned individual has been under continuous mental stress due to family and personal responsibilities. Despite repeated efforts, the person has been unable to resolve these issues, which has affected their peace of mind. Owing to these circumstances, their ability to concentrate on work and daily activities has been impacted. The individual has been trying to manage household obligations, office duties, and personal challenges simultaneously. Several discussions and meetings were held to address the situation, but no concrete resolution could be reached. The ongoing pressure has resulted in emotional strain and exhaustion. Family members and colleagues are aware of the situation and have witnessed the difficulties faced. The person has not intentionally neglected responsibilities; rather, the circumstances have been overwhelming. This statement is given truthfully based on my knowledge and understanding.

Manisha is a resident of Dadhikar village, Alwar aged 42 years. She belongs to a marginal farming household. Concern for family nutrition and increasing food expenses motivated her to adopt a kitchen garden at her residence. An unused open space, with the area of 40 × 20 feet (approx. 74 sq. m.), adjacent to the beneficiary's house was developed into a structured kitchen garden. Support Provided support to grow seasonal vegetable seeds (bottle gourd, ridge gourd, brinjal, tomato, okra, radish, carrots, Spinach, Palak, Dhaniya etc.) Technical guidance on bed preparation, sowing, and crop planning was provided along with regular field-level support by NGO Sapna. The outcome is favorable with the availability of fresh and nutritious vegetables for the household, productive use of fellow land and increased awareness of sustainable and self-reliant food production practices
