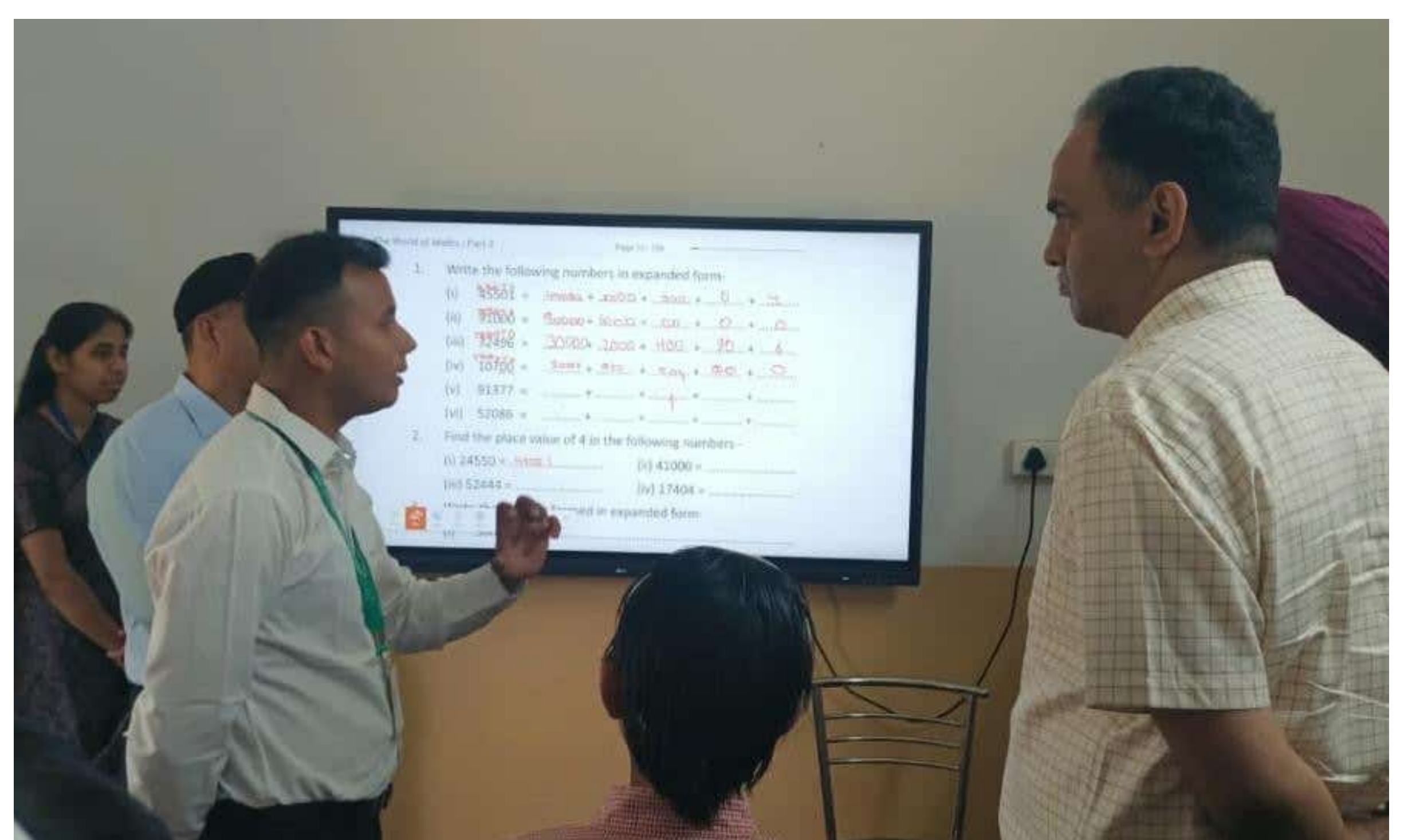
Rural Immersion Programme

Lacking the financial security to build his family a permanent home, he never hoped to sleep under a roof that belonged to him and his family. As days passed, one day his brother asked him to move his family to somewhere else justifying that the house does not have enough space for sustaining both families. Dismayed, he complied and the Patel family took shelter in a temple. Soon, his peril was observed by one of the social worker of NGO Sapna, recommending to build a home for him.

With the support of Dr. Udai S. Singh (ex-Smith, Kline and French Fellow, University of Virginia) we are happy to report that the Patel house's foundations now stand firm as the construction began in June 2026.

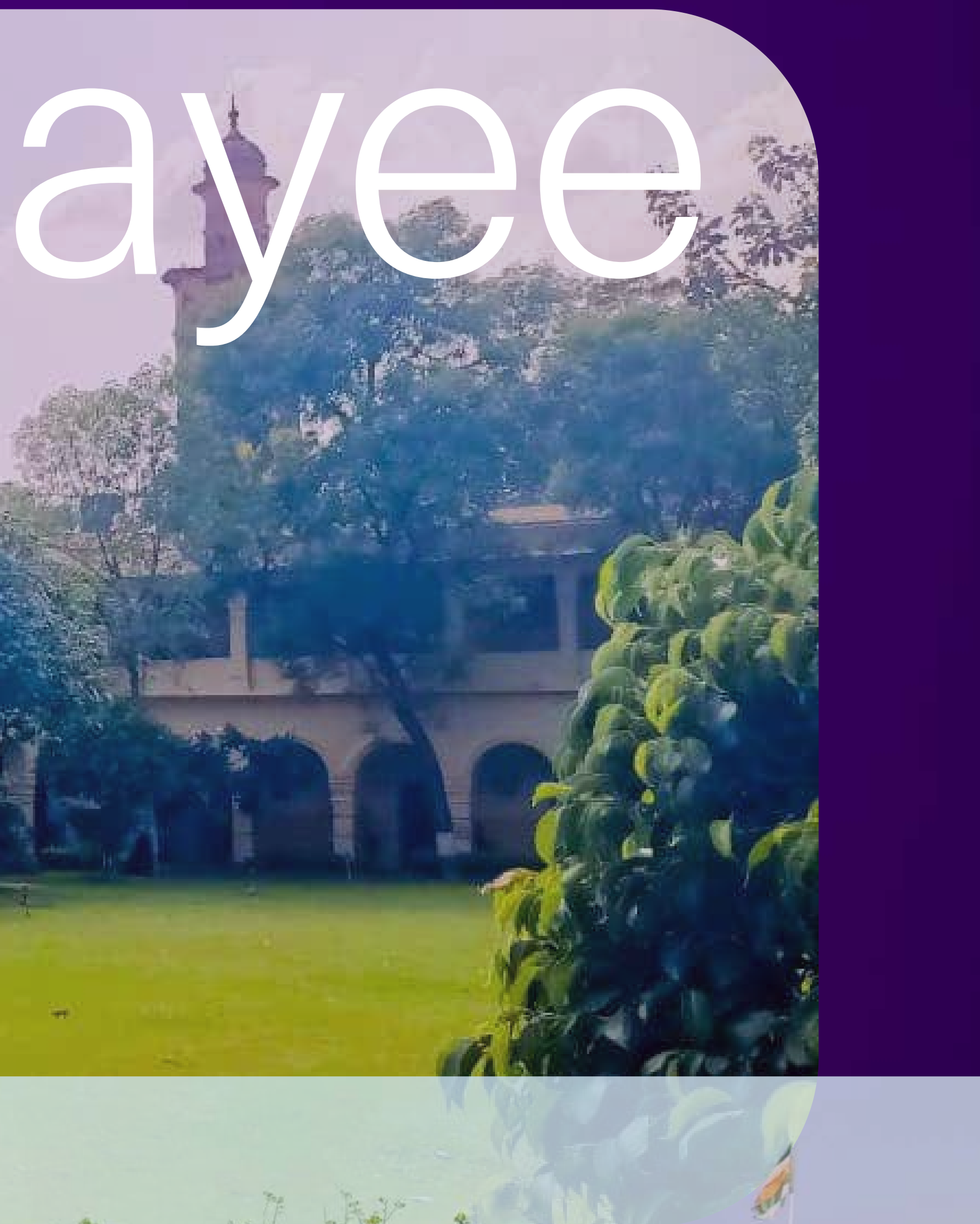

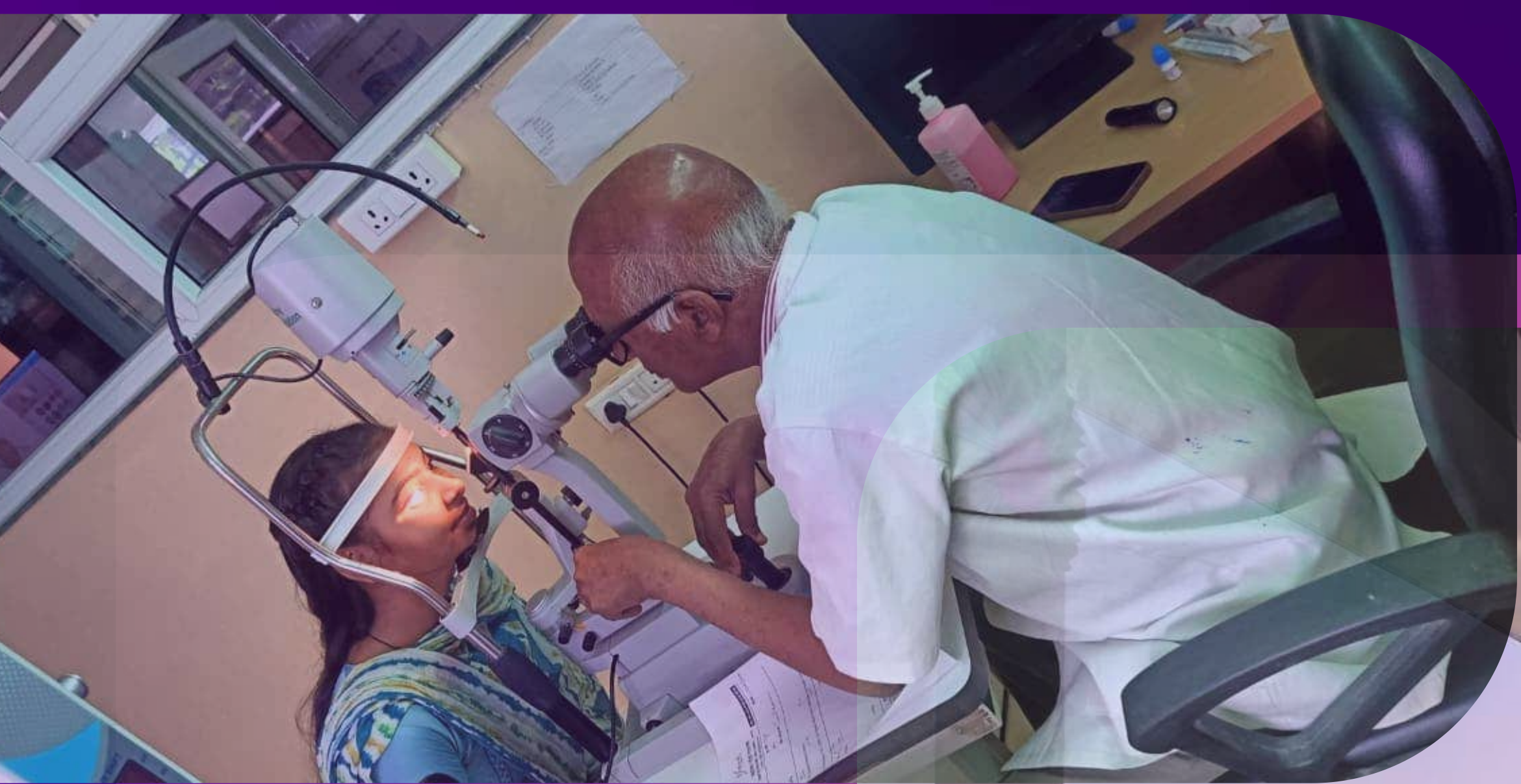


Amity University Student Exposure Visit

The visit was organized to expose 32, 2nd year students to ground reality of development issues faced by the rural population in the region.





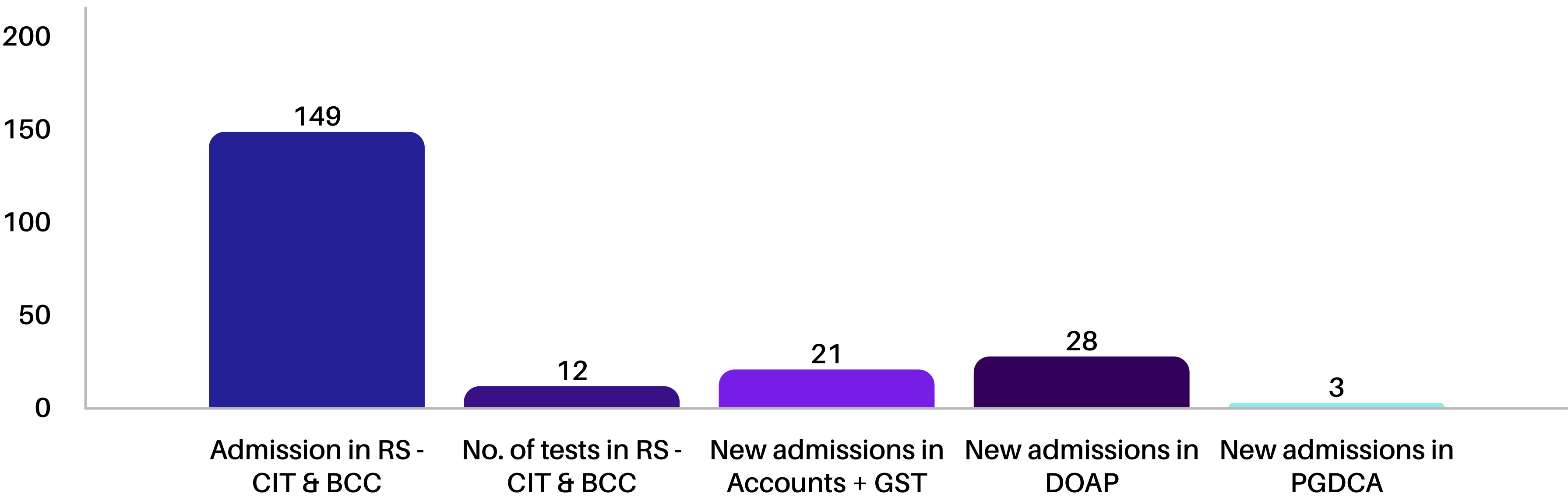

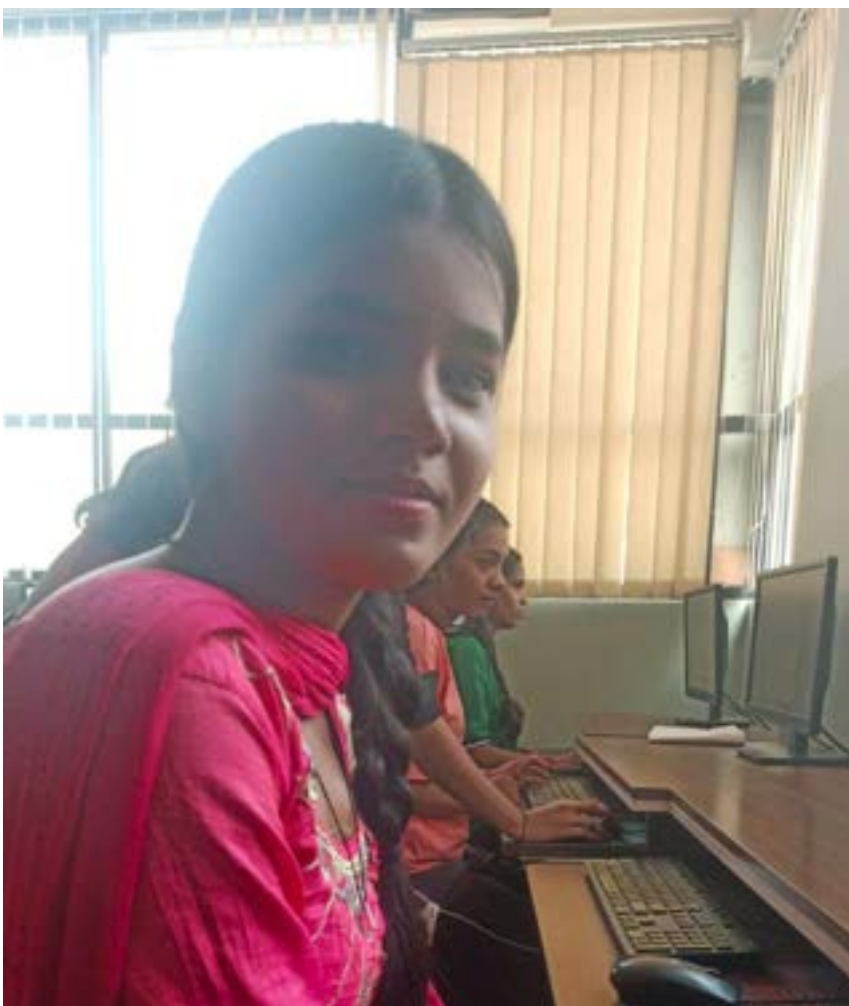
Rather the incident made her more resilient and determined to secure her future. The center trains her in stitching and also guides her to manage her income efficiently.

Case Study



*Life has tested 57-year-old **Jitni Devi** in ways that no one should ever have to endure. Born into a family living in extreme poverty, she spent her entire life struggling to meet even the most basic necessities.*

*On 31st May 2026, Jitni Devi was admitted to the **AIIMS Jai Prakash Narayan Apex Trauma Centre**, New Delhi, after suffering from a serious medical condition. The journey to the hospital was filled with fear, uncertainty, and helplessness. Her family was unable to bear the financial burden of treatment, and as time passed, there was no one willing or able to take responsibility for her care.*

The pain of illness is difficult, but the pain of being alone is even greater. Every day, Jitni Devi watched other patients receive visits from their loved ones while she silently waited beside her hospital bed, hoping that someone would come for her.

*At this critical time, when she had no caregiver or financial support, and nowhere to go after discharge, **NGO SAPNA** stepped forward with compassion and humanity. The organization took responsibility for her care when no one else would. Today, Jitni Devi is staying at the **NGO SAPNA Shelter Home**, where she is receiving care, emotional support, and assistance with her ongoing treatment. **NGO SAPNA** is coordinating her medical follow-ups, helping arrange medicines, providing nutritious meals, and ensuring she has a safe and dignified place to stay during her recovery.*

Case Studies



***Rohit Thakur**, a 37-year-old unmarried man from Shastrinagar Colony, Ghazipur, Uttar Pradesh, has faced many struggles in his life. He belongs to a poor family, and his monthly income is only around ₹8,000 to ₹10,000, which is not enough to manage his medical expenses and daily needs.*

*In 2016, Rohit was suffering from severe **kidney disease**. His condition became critical, and doctors advised an urgent kidney transplant. During this difficult time, his mother, Mrs. Urmila Singh, came forward and donated her kidney to save her son's life. On 8 February 2016, Rohit successfully underwent kidney transplant surgery.*

After the transplant, Rohit's life improved, but he still needs regular medicines and medical checkups to stay healthy.

Due to his weak financial condition, it has become very difficult for him to buy the costly medicines every month. Then in June 2026 upon reaching the social service counter NGO Sapna took care of his post-surgery medical expenses. Since last month we support Rohit with Rs. 5,000/month.

Despite all these hardships, Rohit continues to fight with courage and hope. He now seeks help and support from kind-hearted people and organizations so that he can continue his treatment and live a healthy life.

CANCER SUPPORT

Case Studies



Master *Mohammad Hasan*, a 12-year-old boy from Mohalla Khushipur, Post Jafarganj, Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh, has been diagnosed with *Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML)*, a severe and life-threatening form of blood cancer. He belongs to a financially weak family, and his father, Mr. Mohammad Shameem, works as a daily wage labourer. As the sole earning member of the family, his limited income is insufficient to meet the enormous cost of his son's treatment.

During medical investigations, doctors found that Mohammad Hasan is *FLT3-ITD Positive (High-Risk AML)*, making his condition even more critical. Under treatment at the Pediatric Hemato-Oncology Department at *AIIMS, New Delhi*, where specialists advised urgent and continuous medical care.

As part of his treatment, doctors prescribed *Tablet Midostaurin 25 mg (60 capsules)*, an essential medicine required for his recovery. Since, the cost of this medication is approximately ₹50,000 to ₹60,000, and it is not available free of cost at the hospital. Arranging this amount has become impossible for the family, placing the child's treatment at serious risk. After hearing his case, *NGO Sapna* has provided the family with the medical assistance allowing for the family to continue their son's treatment.

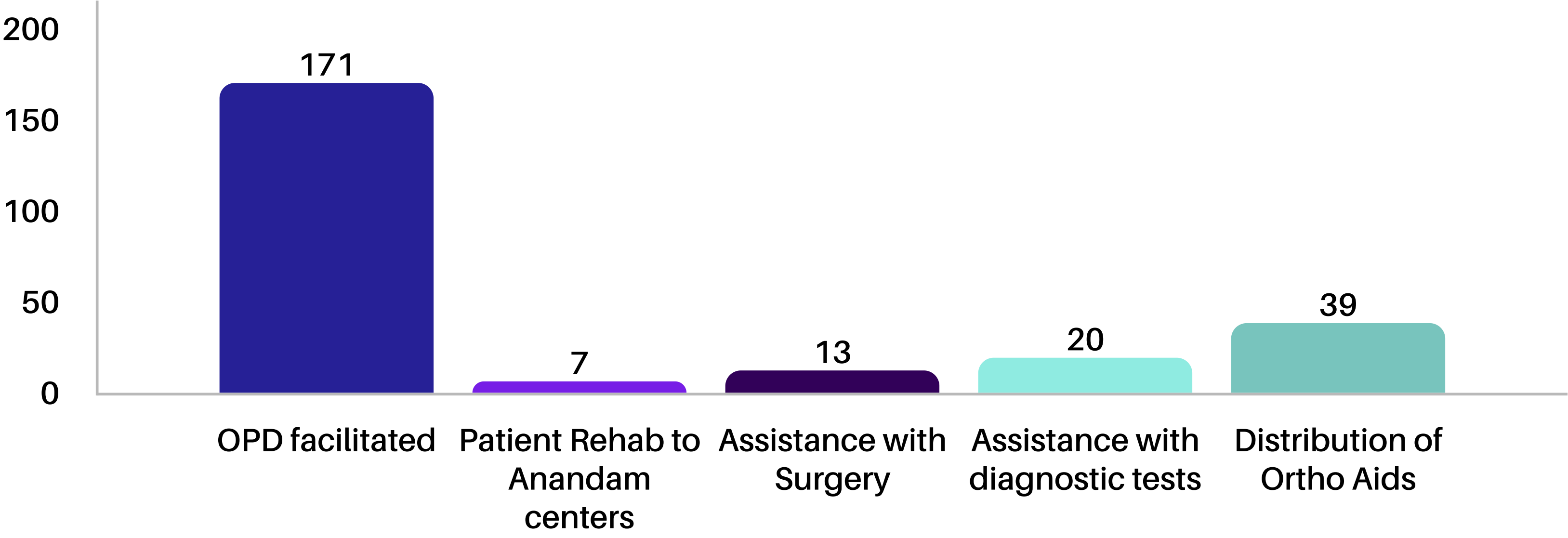

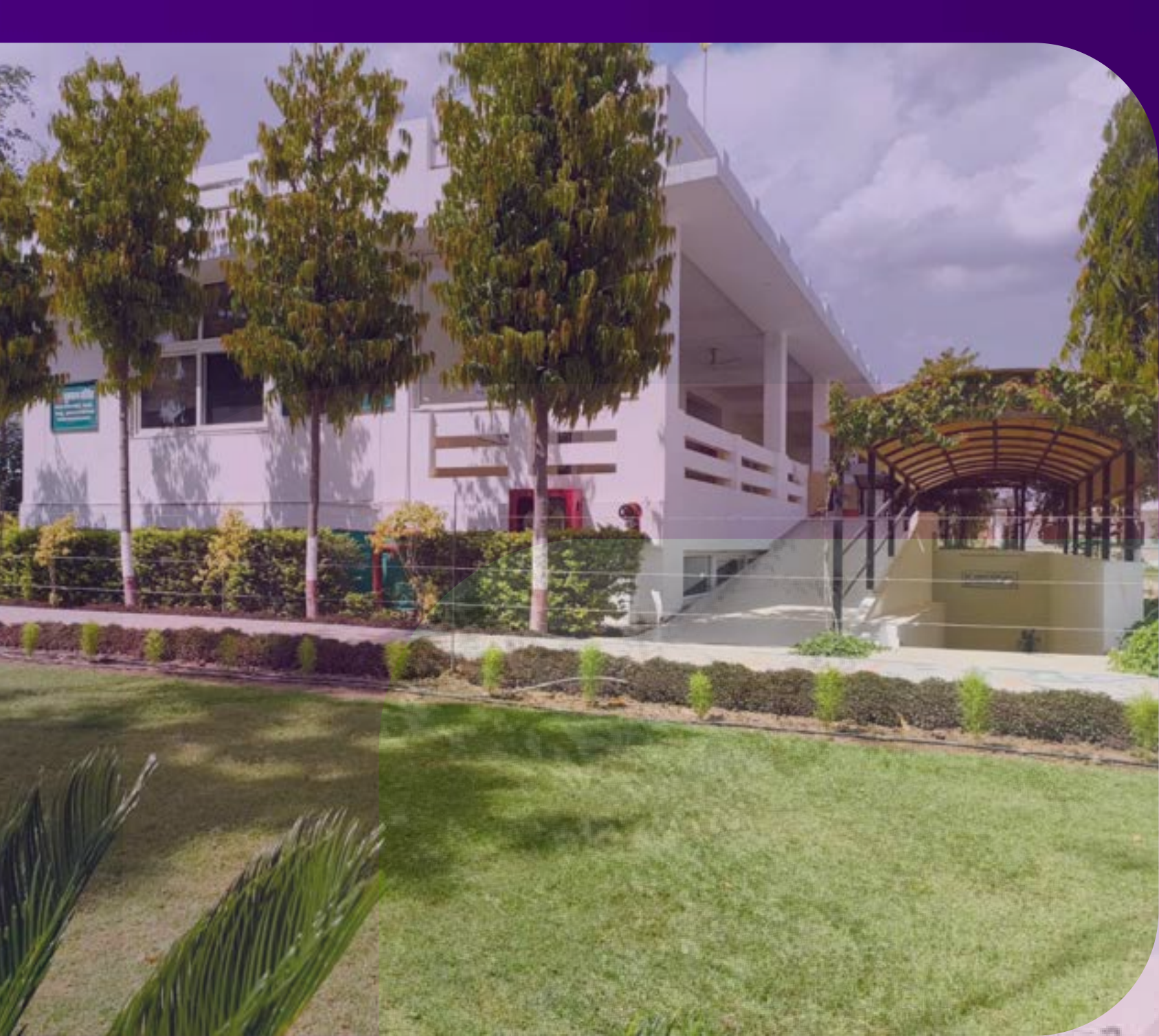


Arushi, an 8-year-old girl hailing from Sohanpur village, Deoria district, Uttar Pradesh, faced a painful and challenging time after she accidentally fell from a tree in June 2025. The fall resulted in a serious fracture of her right hip, causing severe pain and making it impossible for her to walk or perform her daily activities. Her father, Ramesh Singh, works as a daily wage laborer and struggles to support the family with his limited income living in Rajiv Nagar, Faridabad, Haryana. The sudden medical emergency placed an enormous financial and emotional burden on the family.

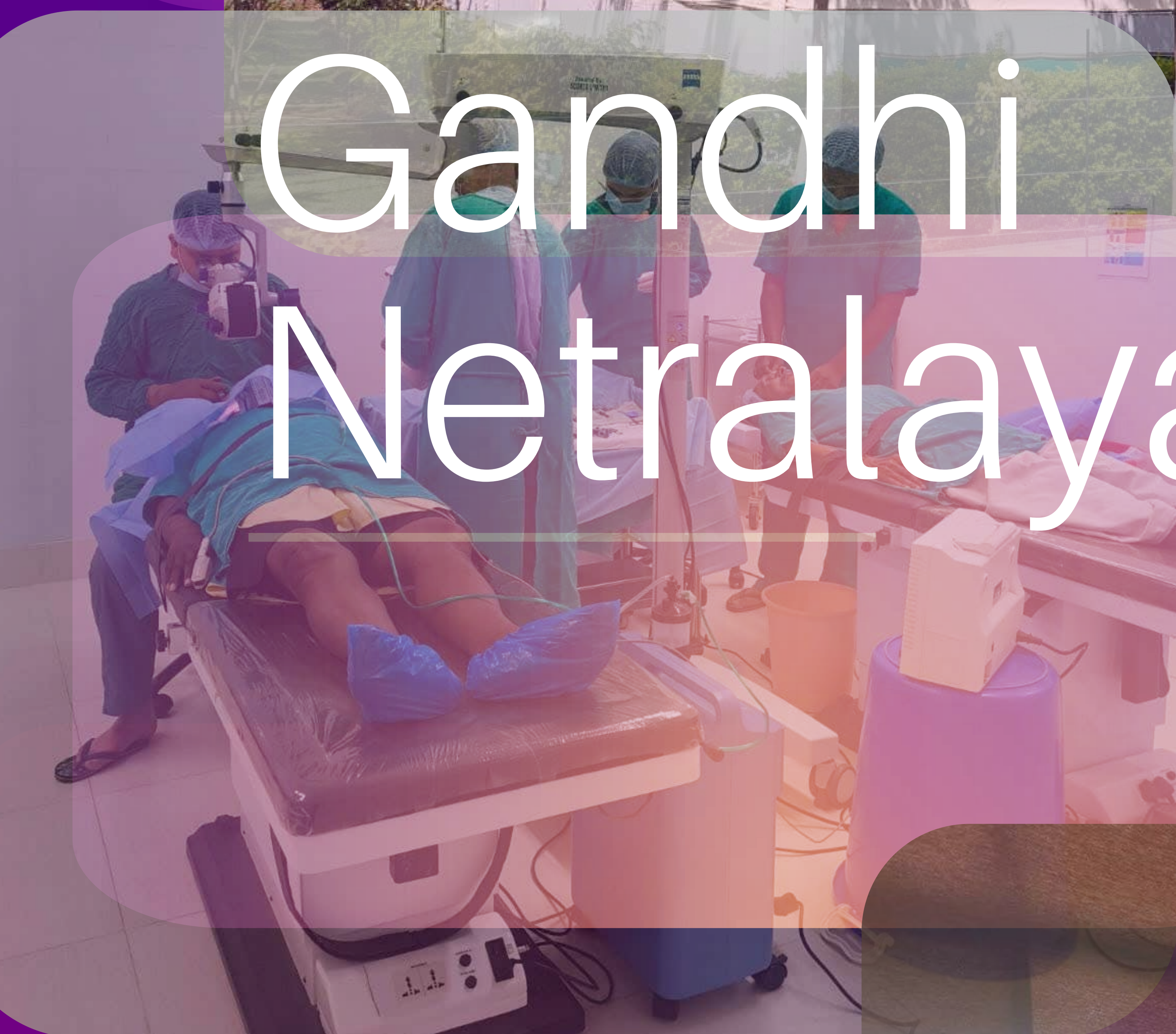
Despite these difficulties, Arushi was admitted to Safdarjung Hospital, where she came under the care of Dr. Vikas Gupta and his medical team. After careful evaluation, surgery was recommended to repair the fracture and restore proper function to her hip. With timely medical intervention and the support of wellwishers, Arushi successfully underwent surgery. The operation was completed successfully, and her recovery journey began.

As her father, Ramesh put it in words: "We were worried about how we would save our daughter and afford her treatment. Today, seeing Arushi recover and smile again is the greatest blessing for our family. We are thankful to everyone who helped us during this difficult time."

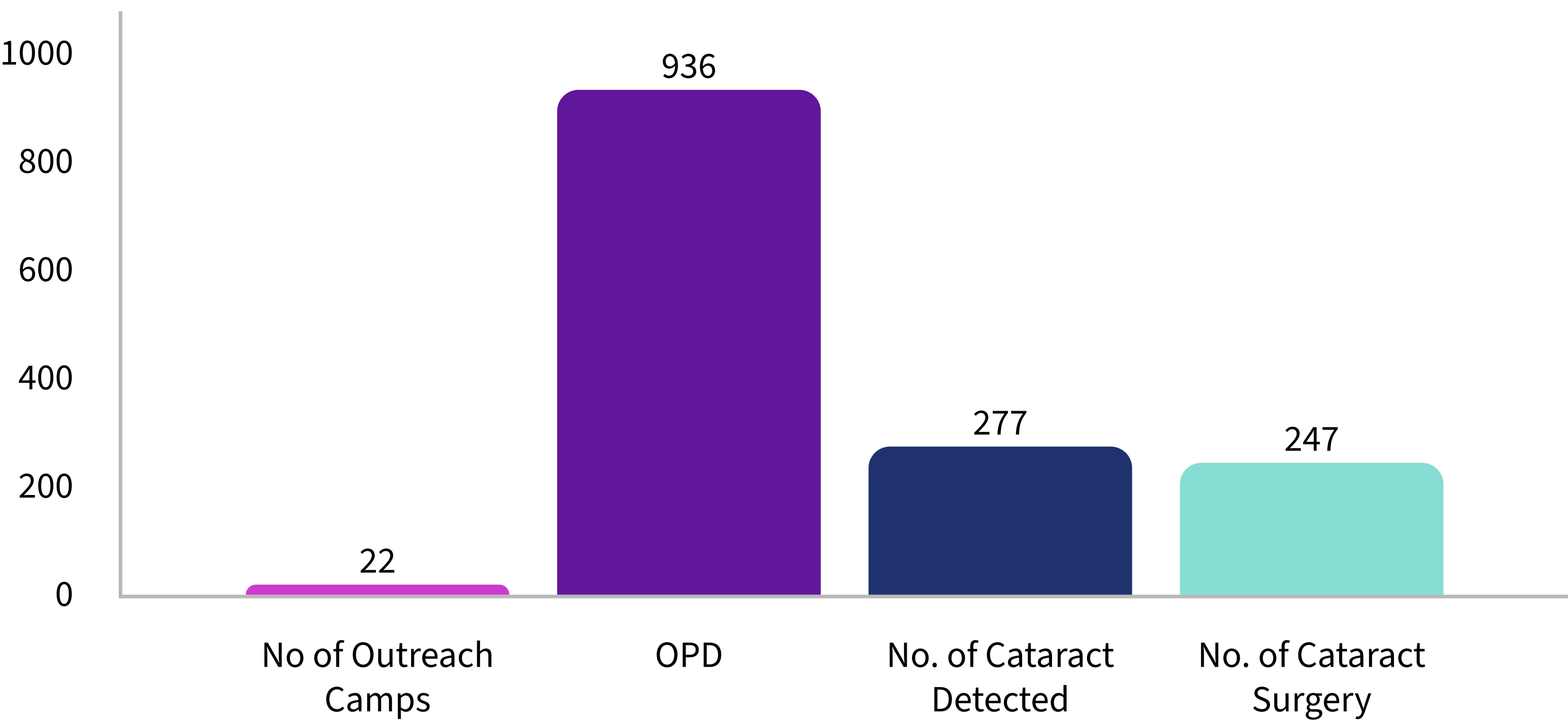

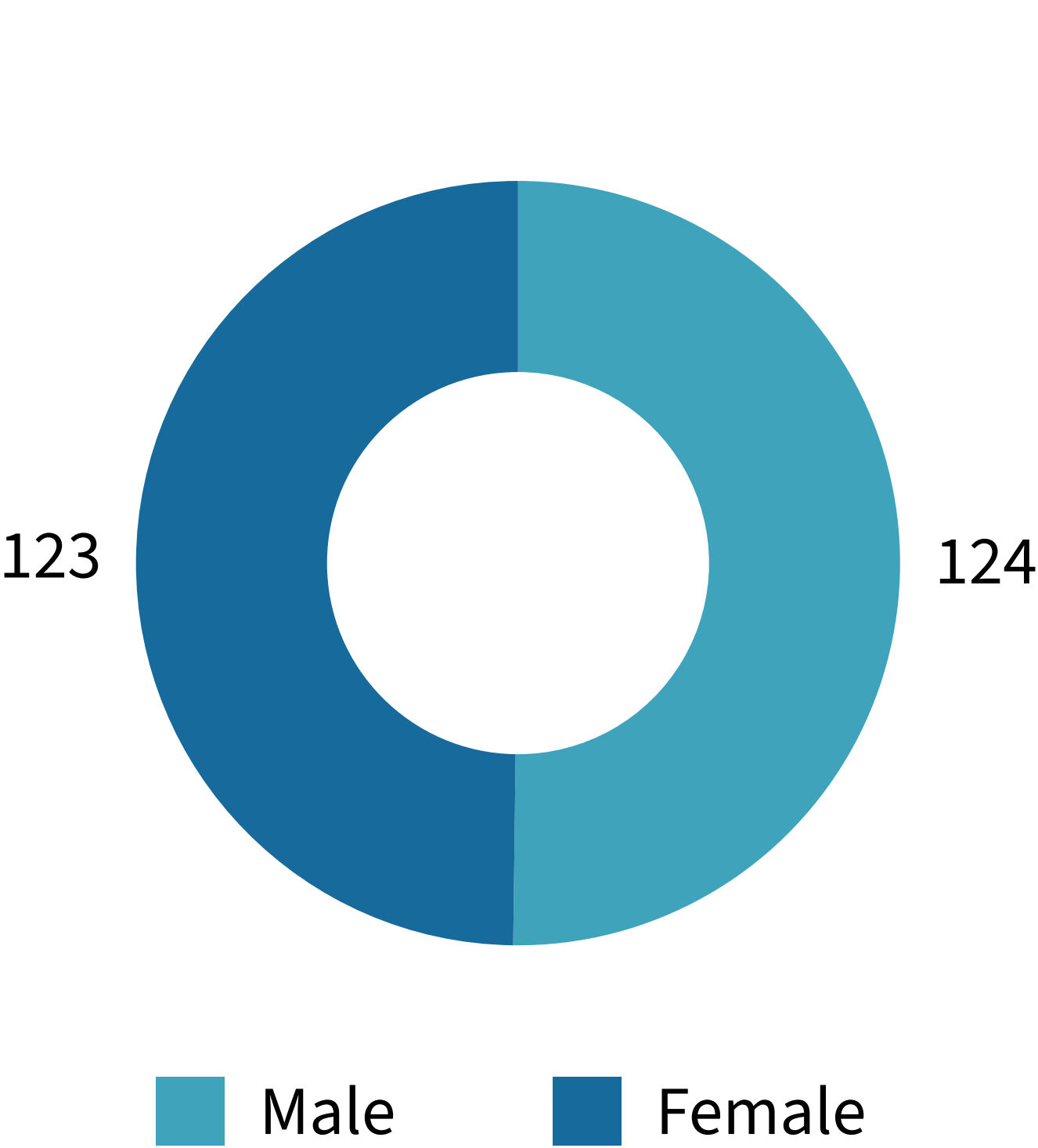

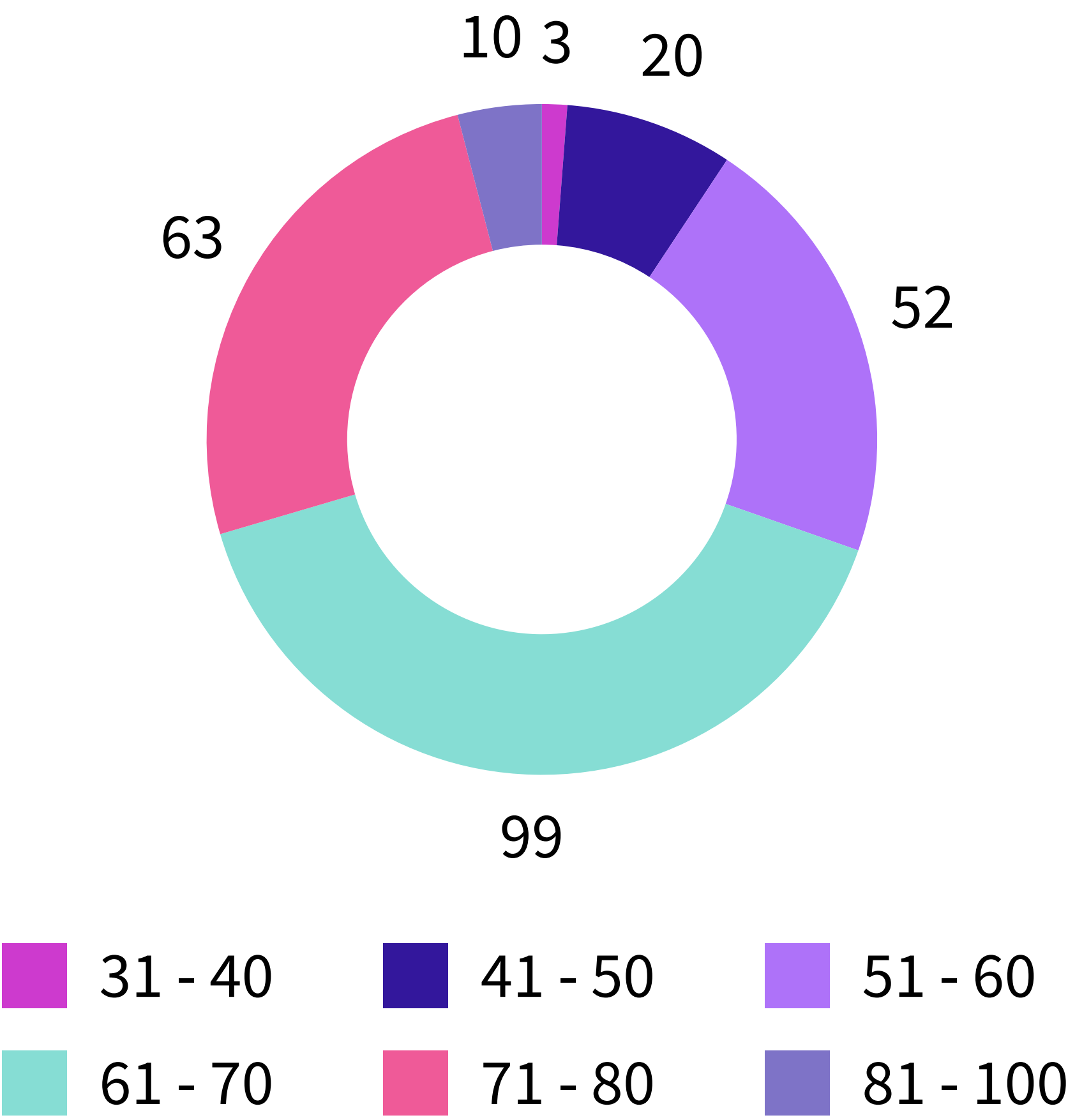
Outreach Camp: Core, Gender and Age Distribution

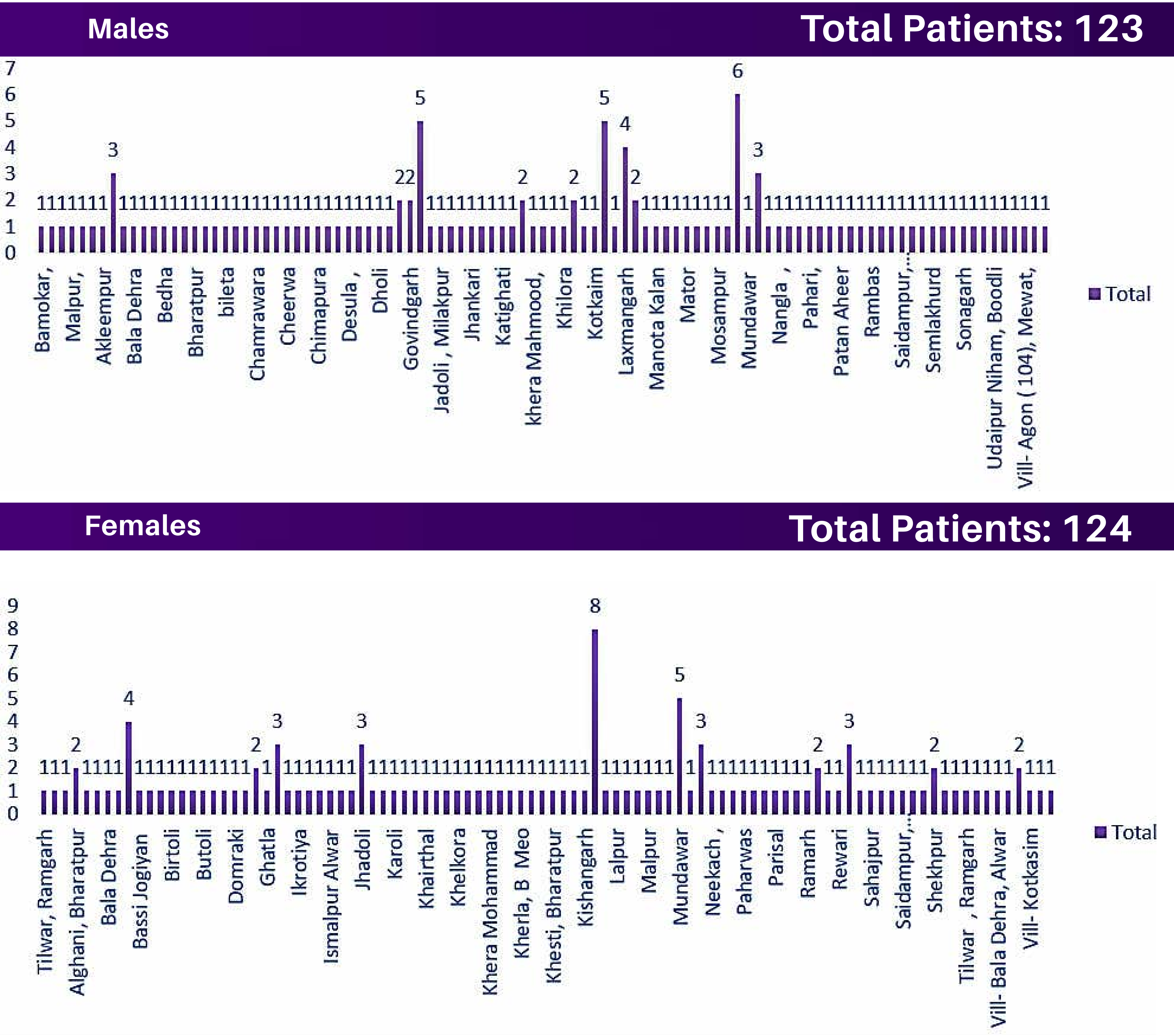

***Sohan Lal** a resident of Bala Dehra, Alwar is aged 75 years. Although blessed with a caring family, he had been facing eye sight problems.*

On 2nd April 2026 Mahatma Gandhi Netralaya organized an eye camp in Harner, near Thanagazi, Alwar. Struggling with his highly limited eye sight, Sohan Lal visited the camp.

There he was diagnosed with cataract with a reduced vision of 6/36. Recommended for surgery, he was informed about the surgery procedure including the 'no cost' programme.

Sohan Lal was admitted on the same day and underwent a successful surgery. Post - operation, his eyes recovered with 6/6 vision.

He expressed his joy and hope "उन्होंने मेरी आँखें बहुत अच्छी बना दी हैं। मैं इसके बनाने वालों (डॉक्टरों) का धन्यवाद करता हूँ।"- Sohan Lal



***Roshani Devi** is a resident of Pahadi, Behror village, Alwar. Aged 57 years, she has been taking care of her home from a long time. However, with time her eye sight began showing signs of weakness. This impacted her dependedent on others.*

Deeply worried she visited the Baroda Meo eye check up camp organized by NGO Sapna.

There, she was diagnosed with cataract and with vision of FC2M. Upon, consulting with the docotros and her family she was admitted and underwent caratact surgery on 5th April 2026. Today, she recorded 6/6 eye sight, and will be following in coming days with doctors.

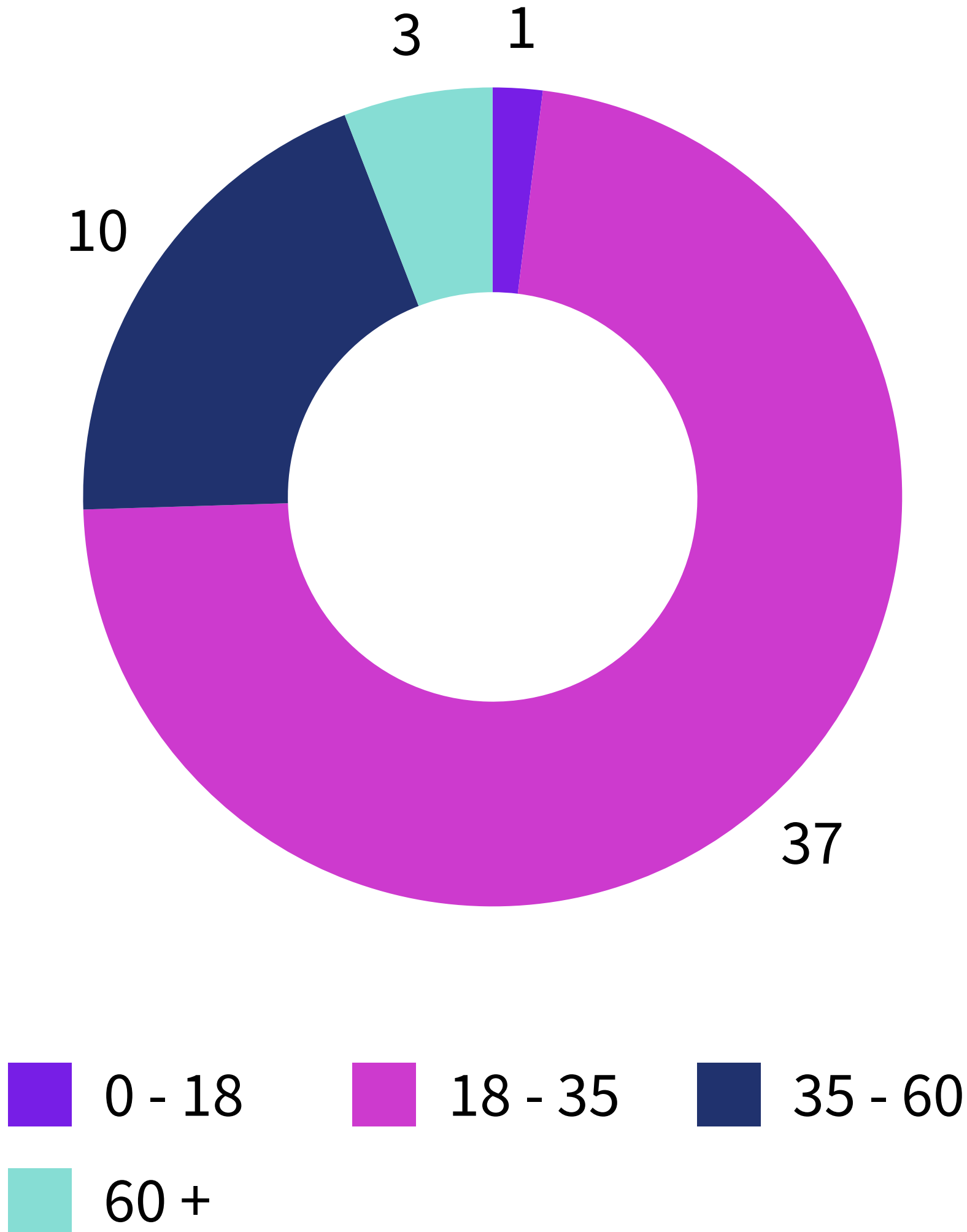

STORIES OF WOMEN & FAMILIES

Case Study

Savitri (name changed) lived with her husband and children in a small village home. Behind closed doors she endured constant emotional abuse, humiliation, and conflict. Her elder and younger brothers-in-law frequently insulted her, and at times the situation escalated to physical violence. She was repeatedly made to feel that she had no place or rights within the family.

Determined to seek help, Savitri approached the Mahila Suraksha Evam Salah Kendra (MSSK), Moti Dungri, Alwar.

At the centre, her story was heard with empathy and understanding. The counsellors carefully assessed the situation and later invited her brothers-in-law and other family members for counselling sessions.

During the family counselling, everyone was encouraged to express their concerns in a respectful environment. The counsellors emphasized that mutual respect is the foundation of every healthy family relationship and explained that domestic violence causes not only physical harm but also deep emotional and psychological trauma.

After several counselling sessions, the family members acknowledged their mistakes and recognized the importance of treating every member with dignity and respect. They realized that the woman they had overlooked was, in fact, one of the strongest pillars holding the family together.

A few months later, Savitri returned to the centre—not with tears, but with a smile. She shared that the atmosphere at home had changed significantly.

STORIES OF WOMEN & FAMILIES

Case Study

*There was a time when **Radha** (name changed) and her family believed that relationships were only about compromises. The bond of trust within the family had weakened, and every conversation gradually turned into an argument. With every disagreement, their relationships moved further towards breaking apart.*

Meera felt that no one truly understood her feelings. On the other hand, her family members believed that Meera misunderstood every situation. The misunderstandings grew so much that the family appeared to be dividing into two separate sides.

At this difficult stage, someone known to the family suggested that they approach the Mahila Suraksha Evam Salah Kendra (MSSK), Moti Dungri, Alwar.

At the centre, the counsellors did not begin by blaming anyone. Instead, they created a safe space where every family member could express their thoughts and feelings. Gradually, it became clear that the main issue was not accusations, but a lack of communication and understanding.

The counsellors introduced an exercise where every family member had to listen to the other person without interruption. For the first time, Meera felt that her voice was being heard. For the first time, her family understood that her pain and concerns were genuine.

Through several counselling sessions, the family learned that relationships are not about winning arguments but about understanding, respecting, and supporting each other.

A few months later, the same family that was once on the verge of separation was sitting together and celebrating festivals with happiness. The laughter and warmth of family life had returned.

In a thank-you letter written to the centre, Meera expressed:

"You did not give us any magic. You taught us how to understand each other. That was the greatest gift for us."

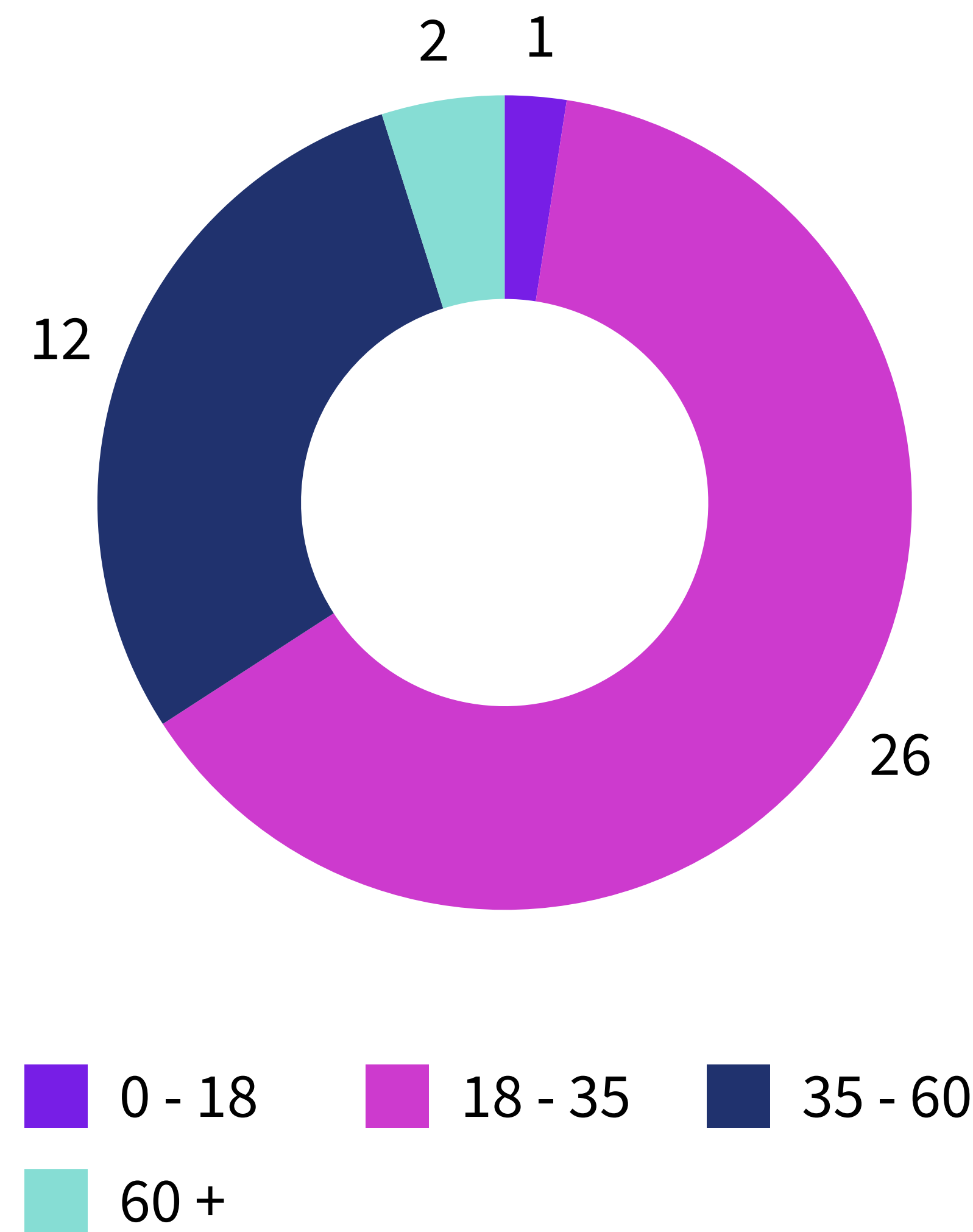

Awareness Program for Women

Date: 11th April 2026

Case Study

Rajrani, wife of Sandeep, resident of Nagaliya, Tijara, came to the counselling centre. She told the counsellor that:

"I have two children. My husband drinks alcohol and beats me and abuses me. He neither gives any money for me and my children nor brings any household items. When I opposed this, me and my children were thrown out of the house. For the past one year, I have been living at my father's house. My husband and my mother-in-law keep harassing me for dowry. My husband beats me, and my mother-in-law, father-in-law, and brother-in-law also harass me along with him. I want my husband Sandeep and his family to be called so that the matter may be resolved."

The counsellor telephoned Rajni's husband, Sandeep. The counsellor spoke with Sandeep and asked him to appear at the Women's Protection Counselling Centre. At the same time, he was also asked to appear along with his family.

Sandeep told the counsellor, "Today my mother is ill; therefore, I will not be able to appear today. Tomorrow I will appear at your office along with my family."

The next day, Rajni and her family appeared at the centre. Sandeep's brother and the Sarpanch of his village were also present. Both parties were seated together, and a counselling meeting was conducted.

Both parties presented their respective views. The counsellor recommended Rajni and Sandeep that they should live together. They decided to live together and agreed that, they would try to balance their lives and support each other.

This was accepted by Sandeep and the Sarpanch of his village. Both parties signed the consent letter. After thanking the counsellor, Sandeep left the center with Rajni to their home along with the Sarpanch of his village.

STORIES OF WOMEN & FAMILIES

Case Study

Jyoti, wife of Mukul, resident of Tijara, came to the MSSK Bhiwadi counselling centre and told the counsellor that it has been 2 years since her marriage. Her husband and in-laws keep troubling her every day. Worse, her husband beats her, rather than standing with her. She wants her husband Mukul and his family to be called so that the problem can be resolved, allowing her to return to her matrimonial home. She have been living at her father's house for the last 6 months.

The counsellor telephoned Jyoti's husband Mukul, spoke with him, and asked him to appear at the Women's Protection Counselling Centre. At the same time, he was also asked to bring his family along. Mukul told the counsellor that he would not be able to come today, but tomorrow he would come to the MSSK center along with his family.

The next day, Jyoti and her family appeared at the centre. Mukul's father and his mediator (go-between) were also present. A joint counselling meeting of both parties was conducted. The counsellor said that the discussion would not proceed until Mukul himself arrived. Mukul's father said, "I will bring him and present him before you tomorrow."

The following day, Mukul and his family appeared at the centre. A counselling meeting of both parties was conducted, and both sides presented their respective views. The counsellor told Jyoti and Mukul that both of you can live together. The couple agreed that no such mistake would happen again in the future.*This was accepted by Mukul and his family.

Both parties signed the consent letter. After thanking the MSSK counsellor, Mukul took Jyoti from the centre to their home along with his family.

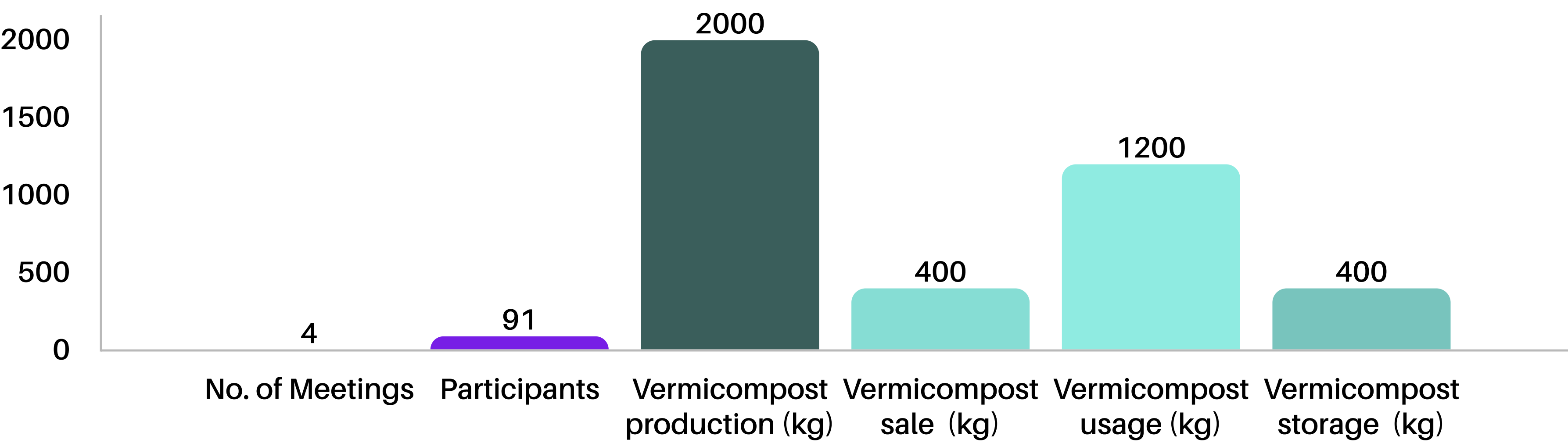

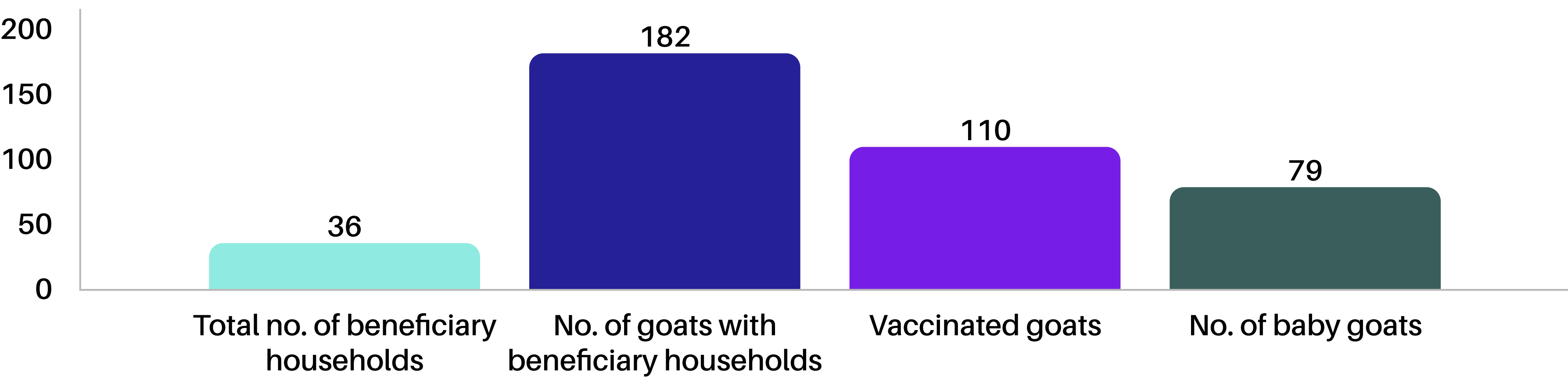
Agriculture Resource Center (ARC)



ARC houses 400 plants in the premises including varieties of Karanj, Papdi, Palash, Imli, Amla, Bael, Nimbu, Neem, Shisham, arjun, moringa etc. The center hosts regular meeting on agriculture & environment awareness and take up village governance issues. The meetings often welcomes representatives of Agriculture department, Forest department, NGO Sapna and the Non govt organization such as Jain irrigation and Weltech. The facility also houses 42 varieties of herbal plants.

ARC center is responsible for stocking necessary plants. This reporting period we have purchased 730 saplings. During this time we have made rounds of maintenance check including carrying out termite treatment at locations, watering the plants and ploughing the land for soil health.
